  - a. Severn Trent environment schemes. Mainly aimed at farmland in the Leam basin. We could ask ST for a virtual meeting and use a report of it to pass on information about slowing run-off. Agreed. Alan Mawer or David Cary to arrange.
  - b. The role of the global food system in driving a massive loss of biodiversity and accelerating climate change. How B-CAN be effective in driving an awareness of the issues, maybe through providing links to certain reports or suggesting links to plant-based alternatives to factory-farmed food sources. Important not to come across as preachy or dogmatic but simply pointing out where factual information about the issues can be accessed. BVN article. Reference https://wickedleeks.riverford.co.uk/
  - c. Use of weedkiller in Braunston. Ask playing field committee.

There was also discussion about taking out insurance.

Tony has proposed that we put a series of articles in the BVN. Some points about potential BVN articles:

- The length of articles for the BVN is usually limited to one page, about 250 words. During the pandemic there has been less information from other groups. As a result, some two-page articles have been included.
- Alan Morgan has said that we must not come across as preachy or dogmatic. I suggest that this can be
  done by describing the actions that people in Braunston have taken that reduce emissions or mitigate
  climate change. Here are some suggestions:
  - Someone who eats only a plant-based diet.
  - A farm where areas of trees have been planted.
  - A farm where a rainwater harvesting system has been installed.
  - A user of peat-free compost.
  - Someone who cycles to work.
  - A user of air-source heating
  - A bus-user
  - A grower of local food, e.g., allotment holder.
  - A property where all rain goes to sustainable drainage.
