The BVN - how you could help

Would you like to join the team?

The BVN is produced by a team of Braunston volunteers. Pete Hobbs looks after the finances and liaises with businesses that support the village newsletter by advertising with us. The editors are Sandra Stapley and Alan Mawer, while Nikki Cary and Liz Fraser are the proof -readers and Deb Hope collects the BVNs from the printers and coordinates all the volunteers who walk round the village putting the paper copies through letterboxes.

We would be pleased to hear from you if you would like to join the team and contribute to producing the BVN.

Much of the editors' work involves juggling space and editing submissions to ensure that it is fair to contributors, easy to read and fits into a newsletter of 36 or 40 pages. The editors also publish each edition online on the village website and on the Issuu platform. Reading the online copy allows you to see the pictures in colour.

The BVN is sent by email to the proof-readers on about the 22nd of each month. They have a tight deadline to read it and list errors, items that need clarifying and suggestions for better presentation. They send this to the editor for that month who prepares the final version and sends it to the printers.

We are grateful to the printers, Design to Print, (their advert is on page 39) who turn the BVN around promptly so that you receive it on about the 1st of the month. Deb has a good team of volunteer distributers but would welcome any new recruits to help when one is ill or on holiday. There's also the possibility that a round will become available for someone who has the time to walk part of the village.

If you would like to volunteer to help with any of the roles, including editing, proof-reading, distributing or on-line publishing, please speak to one of the current volunteers or let us know by email or by taking a note to the Post Office counter so that we could discuss sharing the roles with new volunteers.

The BVN started in 1970 when it was published solely by All Saints' Church. In 2000, in recognition of the role it had in providing information about village organisations and activities beyond the church, the BVN became a joint publication partly financed by the Parish Council.

Printing the paper copies is the only cost incurred in producing the BVN. In 2022 most of the printing costs were met by the businesses who pay to advertise. We thank all of them. We are pleased that the Parish Council and All Saints' Church have no plans to increase the advertising rates for this year.

After receipt of money from advertisers, the remaining costs are split between the Church $({}^{1}/{}_{3}^{rd})$ and the Parish Council $({}^{2}/{}_{3}^{rd})$. The amount paid in council tax to finance the BVN by an average sized household in Braunston comes to 80p per year for all 11 editions. We hope you think this is good value.

Any contribution you would like to make towards the printing costs of the BVN would be gratefully received. There are two ways of doing this. If you scan this QR code you will be taken to the 'givealittle' website where you can choose to make a donation to the BVN. Alternatively, you can write a cheque, payable to 'The



PCC of Braunston', put it in an envelope marked BVN, take it to the Post Office counter and ask for it to be put in the BVN folder.



Vicar's Letter

Have you noticed the days are starting to get longer? I imagine the farmers among you will have. What difference does it make?

For me, it means having a bit longer after lunch before I need to take the dog out for a walk. But no doubt many of you will still be leaving for work or school in the dark, and coming home in the dark too. Happily, the slightly longer daylight hours bring the promise that it won't be like that forever.

This season seems to be all about finding light in the darkness. The church recently celebrated Epiphany – when the Wise Men visit Jesus guided by the light of a star. Of course, they couldn't have seen the star if the sky wasn't dark. A reminder that, even when it's dark we need to pay attention to light.

We are living through some pretty dark days – far darker for some than others. Perhaps it's a little twee, a bit of a platitude, just to say that we need to keep looking for the light even when it's dark. Yet there is some benefit in choosing to see where there is good whilst acknowledging that plenty of evil is being done. We need hope. We also need role models – people who inspire us to make a difference, no matter how small.

Light entering the darkness is the whole point of Christmas. Light overcoming darkness is the whole point of Christianity. Those of us who believe have this hope, and a responsibility. If we have faith, then we have faith that the Light of Christ lives in us. Where are we shining it?

It is all too easy to be overwhelmed by the big problems. We can't save Ukraine. We can't bring justice to people in our own nation trapped in inadequate housing with black mould and no heating, not all of them, anyway. But what can we do? Where does The Light want to shine through you?

Looking for the light is not a sentimental platitude. It's a commitment to being a part of it. For those who are struggling, do let others help. For others, it's looking for opportunities to help. But actually, I think for all of us, it's a bit of both most of the time. That give and take is what forms connections and builds community. It's a conduit for light to shine.

So we wait for the days to lengthen, but we take action to shorten the experience of darkness where we can. May you find joy and hope as you do so.



Improvements to the bus service

The Parish Council has thanked Stagecoach for the improvements to the timetable. There are now nearly double the number of journeys with a bus every hour in most parts of the day, an earlier start to the service and a slightly later finish. The route to Rugby now goes through Barby and the service number is changed to D1.

The council has suggested that the route could be further amended so that it also serves other stops in the parish. We await a response.

At the time of writing the information at the bus stops has not been updated by Stagecoach. We have put a timetable for both the Rugby and Northampton directions in the bus shelter by the Village Hall and a copy of this on page 14.

The single fare for all journeys is £2 until the end of March. All boardings, both fare-paying and concessionary passes, are recorded. Please use the bus as much as possible to help keep the service running to Braunston so that we have the option of using it when we might need it. Even a short trip in the village counts as a journey.

Braunston C of E School

'Impressive' Ofsted report reflects the effort of the school community

The teachers and staff finished for Christmas with smiles on their faces as their Ofsted report was published. Following an inspection in November, inspectors gave Braunston, which is part of the Peterborough Diocese Education Trust (PDET), a 'GOOD' rating overall. The report says that pupils are "proud of their friendly school", with pupils saying to inspectors that their school is a family "because we care and help each other". The report goes on to say that "leaders and staff are ambitious for all pupils" and "have created a positive and purposeful environment for effective learning."

Headteacher, Lianna Willis, said: "We are delighted with the outcome. This judgement is a brilliant reflection of our school's many strengths. What I particularly like are the comments about our children - they truly are the best reflection of what we do well as a school. The inspection team found them to be caring, happy and flourishing in their learning."

The report states that "pupils aim to be responsible citizens in their community and beyond. They fundraise for charities. Older pupils are considerate helpers around the school." They also found that "leaders have ensured that pupils have developed a clear understanding of right and wrong."

Mrs Willis added: "The quality of education we provide has been captured by the inspectors. We put a real focus on reading, and I was delighted that the report says how much our children love reading and can talk about their favourite authors and books they enjoy. We are also very proud of our Forest School provision which gives an outdoor learning opportunity to all children. Being able to share the report makes a wonderful end to what has been a fantastic year for our school and our community."

The inspectors also praised the school's sense of community. The report concludes: "Parents appreciate that their children are happy and learn well at this school. Staff are proud to work here... they say that they are well supported by the trust, leaders and colleagues."

Ruth Walker-Green, CEO of PDET, added: "Alongside the great feedback on learning, what strikes me the most when I read the report is how there is a real team effort to ensure the very best provision for the children."

"My colleagues, both in the school, on the governance committee and across the wider PDET family should be applauded. This is an impressive outcome and one that the whole community should be proud of."

Your Café advertise they have some profits remaining for donation to deserving local causes. More details can be found on www.braunston.org.uk


Braunston CAN (Climate Action Network)

We recently discussed - Food for thought!

The world has recently achieved a new record: there are now 8 billion humans inhabiting the earth - over 3x more than in 1950.

The other mammals that have also increased massively in number during this period are 'livestock' – particularly cattle, sheep and pigs – to provide food for humans.

The environmental consequences of these high numbers in terms of emissions highlight the need to examine more sustainable ways of tackling global food supplies.

This data shows that reducing our meat and dairy consumption - whilst increasing plant-based consumption - would significantly reduce our emissions. It would also provide other major benefits: more efficient use of land and water; reduced pollution; better animal welfare; improved health outcomes across the globe.

Early December saw the start of a BCS project to rebuild the steps at bridge 98. CRT West Midlands



asked if we could help. The steps are on a popular Braunston walking route and had already been closed. After an initial survey that found most of the wood was rotted the BCS committee decided to take the job on. Preparations began in November with a design that was subsequently approved by CRT. This was followed by the procurement and preparation of materials.

With a four day window of opportunity work commenced at the beginning of December. Work boat 'Skippy' was needed to transport men, materials and equipment to the site, the only other access being a rough track passing Wolfhampcote church.

With daylight hours being short, time on site was limited but after four visits significant progress had been made.

BCS were hoping to complete the project before Christmas with three additional visits. This plan was thwarted by the canal freezing over. 'Skippy', as useful as she is, could not navigate safely due to her square bow even against relatively thin ice. The BCS crew resolved to return in the New Year to complete the project.

I've been exploring an idea to tell the stories of the village in the 1920s based on the 1921 census, news items and a 14-week strike by boatmen - far from being quiet and peaceful it was kicking off in Braunston in the 20s! We had some funding to do some exploring – meetings with local groups, workshops in the school and with the Players and now the Arts Council have awarded us a grant for a full-on community theatre project. There will be something for everyone to join:

- Local history research,
- 'Have a go' writing and drama workshops
- Performing as an actor or musician
- Helping backstage

Prior to Richard's death we wrote this article for the BVN. We have decided to publish it as it was initially written. We wish Jean all our support and love at this difficult time.

A Village Thank You to Jean and Richard Dibben

The Braunston Village Gardens Association is in the privileged position of being able to thank Jean and Richard Dibben for their amazing contribution to the BVGA committee.

Looking back to April 1967, at the AGM held at the school, we find Mr and Mrs Dibben being welcomed to the committee by Mr J Wright, Mr R.F. May, Mr O. R. Tucker and Mr B Harrison. In December 2022, at our recent AGM, Jean and Richard stood down from the committee after 55 years and we were delighted to be able to thank them for all their contributions. Within a month of the 1967 AGM they were helping to run the annual Flower Show and within six months Richard was elected to his first officer role. During the 55 years Richard held the position of Chairman, Show Secretary, Treasurer and organised the 'Fertiliser Store'. Most recently, he has been Vice Chair ensuring a smooth transition for new committee members and officers by sharing



his knowledge and experience of the organisation.

Members of the 1970s committee celebrate 60 years of the BVGA (2015) Having hosted the BVGA committee meetings in their home from 1968 it was no surprise that Jean, in 1977, took on the role of Treasurer. But, to then stay in that role for 45 years is clearly an incredible service to the village, for which we all say a huge thank you. With Jean's clarity of accounting and understanding of our annual expenditure she has ensured that the BVGA continues to run successful events for the benefit of the whole village community as well as supporting other good causes. The Village Open Gardens event, raising funds for the Daventry area Macmillan Cancer Support charity, would not be taking place if it had not been for Jean and Richard. They both ensured the continuity of BVGA events, for example, regularly escorting the Garden Competition judges and explaining to new committee members how this unusual annual competition, where nobody has to enter, is organised. Over 10 years ago Richard was encouraging the addition of peat free compost to the 'Fertiliser Store', determined to support this initiative and reduce the damage caused by horticulture to precious peat bogs.



We thank Jean and Richard, on behalf of everyone who has enjoyed BVGA activities, for all that they have done to "promote interest in gardening" in Braunston and ensuring that this village organisation is fit and healthy to flourish for many more years.

Finally, when thanking

them we should remember that their volunteering goes beyond gardening. Richard played a role in the conversion of the old school to a village hall, and served that committee for many years. Jean, an active member of the Girl Guides Association, ran a village group and continued as a member of the Trefoil Guild. Both organised the Braunston WEA courses with Jackie Green and, over many years, they have volunteered for a number of charities in the Daventry area.
