Church letter

For some, with young families the month of September brings an end of annual holidays. With it comes an expectation for infants of their first taste of full time schooling. This is an exciting time as well as perhaps, a time of nervousness. It is the start of a young person's education lasting many years and can lead into adulthood. It is also for older children to move to secondary schools. This can also be somewhat daunting but new friendships are soon formed as they settle in their new surroundings. This is a time when in some cases ideas start to appear as to future career paths or interests. School days come to an end after exams with the option of college or university, apprenticeship, or other training. Those who have children, or grandchildren or even great grandchildren will share with them the mixed feelings of joy and anxiety throughout their education.

September used to be a busy time on farms with harvest, but with advancement in crop production and management, and also the changing of weather conditions this timing has moved forward by at least a month. A time for farmers and gardeners to look back and see the fruits of their labours, or otherwise! It is a time to prepare the farms and gardens for the winter period and make sure everything is left neat and tidy. On a personal point of view a case of do as I say, not as I do!



Parish Council Surgery

Councillors Caroline Gibbons and John Pomfret will be in the meeting room at the Village Hall from 5pm to 6pm on Friday September 8th to discuss any questions or issues parishioners would like to raise.

Maple Close extension

Neil Gilliver, Development Services Manager for the Midlands Rural Housing Association, gave a presentation to the Parish Council about the proposed extension of Maple Close. The proposal is for 21 social rent homes consisting of:

2 x four bedroom houses 5 x two bedroom bungalows 4 x three bedroom houses 4 x one bedroom maisonettes

6 x two bedroom houses

The proposal will be finalised and a planning application submitted in the autumn.

When completed the homes will be allocated to people on the housing list who have a Braunston connection. The housing list is managed by West Northamptonshire Council. Prior to completion there will be a housing event in the village similar to the one held for the previous phase, when local people with housing needs will be encouraged to apply.

To increase efficiency, the homes will be built to standards that exceed building regulations.

The provision of social rented homes means that the proposed site qualifies as a Rural Exception Site under the terms of the West Northamptonshire Strategy and as such is supported by the Braunston Neighbourhood Development Plan.

Community Governance Review

The Parish Council has agreed to take part in the Community Governance Review being carried out by West Northamptonshire Council. The review will consider various points relating to parish councils including the number of councillors and parish boundaries.

Bench on The Green

Sections of wood in the current bench have rotted. It was agreed to replace it with a bench made from recycled plastic.

Report from WNC ward councillor Rosie Humphreys

The Serious Violence Duty legislation was introduced in January and requires organisations across the public sector to work together locally to plan and prevent incidents of violence, making local communities safer. The current survey asks anyone affected by serious violence in the last 12 months to give their views on its impact, as an individual, on families and on the community. All responses will be treated anonymously. Serious violence includes domestic abuse, sexual and youth (under 25) violence. The consultation closes on 27th October and can be found at westnorthants.citizenspace.com/community-safety/serious-violence-survey/

Public events are also planned to raise awareness and collect information.

Home to School Transport

The Cabinet approved the changes to this policy, details in my report last month. The changes will apply from September 2024. The changes to the current policy, which has not been reviewed for 10 years, as regards the increase of a non-entitled bus pass from £600 to £1,000 p/a will affect 168 current students. No phasing in of the cost will be considered as this will not achieve the intended savings targets, however a payment plan will be available. This increase will inevitably hit many families hard.

The Council will continue to provide free home to school transport to a child's nearest or Geographically Associated school where this is over the statutory walking distance, or where the walking route is deemed unsuitable.

WNC ward councillor Alan Chantler

Councillor Alan Chantler reported that WNC have bought a new Jet pothole filler for £500 000 that will make repairs quicker and cheaper to carry out.

He also told the council that WNC have appointed a new planning enforcement team.

Parish Councillor Caroline Gibbons

While I had no water and heating I had numerous cups of tea at the Café. They made me feel very welcome. Hairdressing since moving into the village and remembering when she was doing her training through the salon I met and still meet many very interesting and friendly villagers.

Unfortunately, in March 2020 after having Covid I broke my ankle and could not believe the overwhelming help and support received from Heart, the Community Car, and the people of the village. After Covid, I volunteered with Heart and at the Community Café and regularly go in for a chat to support the Café. Only a few weeks ago Isabel was chatting to a lady who had come from Canada and used to live in the village, next thing Isabel and the volunteers had arranged for her to meet up with villagers who had remembered her, this is real community spirit and was a lovely event. We are so lucky to have such a wonderful village, with a lot of facilities, and thoughtful, caring residents.

Having had many career paths in my life and various volunteering positions, working both with international charities like Water Aid and Handicap International, and locally like the Woman's Refuge and Hope 4, I see my skills as transferable especially in the charities and volunteer sector, so am wanting to help and give back to the village. 

July's first task party welcomed 10 volunteers from RS Components (Corby). 18 willing and able crew, painted lock 5 at pace. The 'lock waiting' bollards along the towpath were also painted. Unfortunately the wet weather arrived earlier than expected causing a

hasty retreat to the welcoming environs of the Nelson pub.

Workboat 'Skippy' was in action again for our second task party when a crew of 9 replaced the rotted post and rail fence on the steps at lock 5. A rotted rail was also replaced on the weir fence and all the rails given a coat of paint. This year's vegetation growth on the weir was removed as were the arisings from strimming the lock offside.





Several ad hoc task parties this month saw, restoration of the fence that had been pushed over by the fallen hawthorn trees near the marina entrance, grounds maintenance at Midland Chandlers and the junction facilities area, refitting a coping bumper beam that had come loose above lock 2 and the vegetation strimmed along the

path from Butchers Bridge to the village.

Electric Vehicle Charging in the vicinity of Braunston

Last month I provided details of commercial electric vehicle charging facilities in Braunston. This month I aim to reassure you that even without a charger at home you can charge when going about your day-to-day activities in places like shopping centres, town centres, supermarkets and even golf clubs. Ultra rapid charging solutions are increasingly available.

There are accessible chargers in Daventry that are convenient to use when shopping. There are 3 rapid chargers in Bowen Square. These are tethered 50kwh chargers with CCS and Chadmeo connectors in the

Osprey network and various payment options including credit cards are available.

Other ultrarapid chargers are at McDonalds where Instavolt have installed 2 chargers with CCS (120kwh) and Chadmeo connectors (50kwh). Tesco also provide 2 7kwh rapid chargers with 5 type 2 connectors in partnership with Pod Point. There is also a 7kwh charging unit at Staverton Park Hotel.

There are also chargers in the public car parks such as Newlands near Aldi with 4 untethered type 2 7kwh chargers, Lodge Road (with extended parking provision) and near the Arc Cinema.

For people street parking in Rugby town centre, there are 7kwh untethered devices provided by BP Pulse in Lancaster Road, Regent Street and Barby Road. There are also facilities at McDonalds, Rugby Golf Club, Rugby Self Store, and a charging station on Lawford Road. When shopping in Elliots Field free charging is possible with a 7kwh device with 2 type 2 connectors. A key to the charger can be obtained from the counter in Halfords. Tesco also has 2 devices provided by PodPoint delivering 7kwh with 4 type 2 connectors.

An interesting local charging facility which reflects what we may see more of in the future is the new facility at the M6 East Rugby Services where a state of the art 12 device Tesla 250kwh ultrarapid charging forecourt has been built alongside a complementary Gridserve 12 device 350Kwh CCS/100 Kwh Chadmeo ultrarapid charging forecourt.

The Holiday Inn and Ibis Hotels at the Crick Junction both have charging facilities provided by BP Pulse.

I have put a more detailed description of EV charging facilities in the local area on our page in the 'Village Info' section of the village website under 'Climate Emergency' and on Facebook at 'Braunston Climate Action Network' (BCAN).

The Midweek league has been completed and the club avoided relegation by beating the top two teams in consecutive matches. The highlight was the resounding defeat of previously unbeaten Newbold by 10 wickets. Newbold were dismissed for 116 with Noah Eyles, the pick of the bowlers with 3 for 17. Elijah Glover and Jordan Shingler then had no trouble in scoring the required runs on their own to give the club only their third 10 wicket win in 42 years in the Rugby and District midweek league. A further comprehensive win against North Kilworth and a rained -off match at Old Laurentians meant that we were mathematically safe going into the last match against Long Itchington. We then had little difficulty in scoring 83 for 3 with Karthik and Richard Stapley dominating the innings with a fine 50 run partnership. This leaves the seconds in mid table in their division.

Three Sunday friendlies were also played. In friendlies the results are often not as important as the opportunity it gives to new or inexperienced players to get match time. This has been particularly relevant for several of our newcomers this year, with Aaran Biddle, Christian Jacobs and Luke Hill all showing great promise and will be assets to the league teams in the very near future. For the record the games against Rugby and Badby & Farthingstone were very tight affairs with both teams adopting the same approach. The third was a drubbing in the rain by Napton, who obviously thought that winning was more important than player development.
