
Tiny Treasures


We are meeting now in the **Parish Room in the Church**. The Church door will be open just come on in.

Braunston CAN (Climate Action Network)

Our webpage is in the 'Village Info' section of the village website, under 'Climate Emergency'. If you are interested in joining us, please message 07989 421836 or 07554 264742. We are on Facebook as Braunston Climate Action Network (B-CAN).

We recently attended HOP 22, a climate exhibition arranged by Harlestone Parish Council as an opportunity to meet representatives of companies and organisations tackling climate change.

The Northamptonshire Natural History Society had a display of local data comparing temperatures recorded in Pitsford in the 19th century with recent records. Most striking was the big reduction in the occurrence of low minimum temperatures. These were much more common in the 19th century as illustrated by pictures of ice skating on the River Nene.

Other organisations represented included the Woodland Trust, Living Streets Northampton, Climate Action West Northants, Fruitful Abundance, Garden Organic, Harlestone Wild Bunch, and Better Crick. The charity Recoup campaign for easier plastic recycling. Slowfashionbus is a small organisation in Towcester that promotes mending clothes and recycling fabrics to reduce waste.

Octopus Energy were offering £50 credit to anyone who signed up for their energy as well as £50 to a charity of the customer's choice. Sheaf Street Health Store had samples to taste and products for sale.

Last month we also arranged a meeting with the Development Officer for Walking and Cycling in the Travel Choices department of West Northamptonshire Council. This was a site to look at our suggestion of extending the Daventry to Braunston cycle route into Warwickshire and link with National Cycle Routes. We hope to take this up with Sustrans, the charity making it easier for people to walk and cycle.

We attended an online event that outlined West Northamptonshire's Enhanced Partnership Plan to improve bus services. If this could be implemented it would lead to the resumption of an hourly service through Braunston. Unfortunately it seems unlikely that the government will provide the finance to support this.

Shuckburgh 19/3/22

Unbroken sunshine greeted us as 19 of us set off to drive to Lower Shuckburgh. We had four new members join us today and they are most welcome. I think they enjoyed the walk. We strolled through the village and then entered the estate of Shuckburgh Hall. It is a steep climb from here through the parkland with the estate church nestling in the woods. You get fantastic views across the Warwickshire Plain from here. We paused to look at the magnificent hall itself and then dropped down past the stables to reach the lodge cottage and a lane towards Park Farm. To avoid sinking into knee deep mud we turned onto a field path behind the farm and followed it all the way to a junction to join the Priors Marston Road. Hardly any mud.

We followed the road, then branched off left over fields and obstacle course stiles. The ground dropped away with fabulous views over to Napton. It was steeply downhill and then a gentle climb to the village. We strolled down the lane to The Folly pub which is next to the canal. At this stage we had walked about five miles.

We enjoyed our lunch in a very comfortable building which they call the Potting Shed. In the afternoon we followed the canal towpath all the way back to the cars. We passed Wigram's Turn where the Grand Union joins the Oxford Canal. I recall a picture of Braunstonites enjoying a picnic here many years ago.

This is a great walk through some spectacular scenery and all on our doorstep.

By the time this edition of the BVN is published and distributed winter nets will have finished and hopefully the weather will be good enough for us to use the outdoor nets at the playing field. We will also have spent a whole day using a hired heavy roller to flatten the pitch as the first part of our preparations for our first home game on Saturday 23rd April against Dunchurch & Bilton.

Jetty Field

Spring has arrived and Jetty Field is starting to look a little more colourful. The purple crocuses and yellow daffodils dotted along the path down to the main field look a picture, especially in the bouts of sunshine we have enjoyed in recent days. The hedging saplings planted last autumn are beginning to bud, as are the fruit trees in the orchard.

The volunteer work party this month spent time tidying up the corner of the field aerating the grass cuttings and using it to mulch the trees growing along the boundary wall. The ruts caused by the tractor when the field was mown earlier in the month were also repaired. It is no surprise that the ground is so soft following the wet weather earlier in the month.

The gate leading to the path near Archer Avenue has now been repaired and the clogged up ditch has now been cleared allowing surface water to drain away.

The next work morning will be on Saturday 9th April at 9 am and the next committee meeting will be in the Wheatsheaf on Thursday 7th April at 7.30pm

After many years as Secretary Zara Corbin has had to resign and she has been replaced by Bob Tuck. The committee would like to thank Zara for all the work she has done over the years.

Braunston Canal Society

For the first task party in February the BCS crew split into 3 teams. Using Skippy, a team of 5 performed an offside cut between the Stop House and bridge 91 (A45). This was mirrored by a team of 4 cutting the towpath side. The third team set about removing trees that were overhanging the Stop House bin compound area.

Later that month, with a crew of 5 on Skippy and 7 on the bank, BCS had no problems in completing the offside/onside cut below the flight. Several branches overhanging the towpath were removed and, along



with the arisings from the offside, were transported and stacked at the Midland Chandlers water point ready for chipping in March. In addition, the ivy enveloping the Stop house bin compound was removed and a considerable amount of litter and rubbish was collected and disposed of.

Ad hoc task parties this month included replacing the lock beam signs, cutting hedges at UCC and filling a wash hole in the towpath below lock 2.

Any payment is by voluntary contribution. Some journeys are provided in volunteers' own cars.



Extracts from Historical Notes published in old editions of the BVN

February 1999 Village Notes by Derek Turner

Derek used to run the village post office with his wife Joan

Did you know that Braunston once had an orphanage?

The orphanage was at 36 High Street and was initially run by the 'Guardians of the Poor of Daventry and District' and opened about 1904. It was later under the jurisdiction of Northamptonshire County Council and was known as 'The Cottage Home'. Formerly a farmhouse, a wing was added to the building accommodating a dormitory, dining room and bathroom. An outbuilding was extended upwards and became an isolation block! From visible and verbal evidence it appears that the living conditions were somewhat spartan. The home closed in 1935, the house was sold, and a shop was built on the front and became the Post Office in 1938.

Also by Derek Turner

The item written by Dick Herne, on Braunston's industry, and especially on the Drill Factory, brought to my mind the effect that Mason Master had on our village Post Office. When my parents took over the Post Office in 1938 mails were received via Midland Red bus, and the evening mail despatched by rail. The bags were carried to Braunston station by Tom Quinney and Bill Meacham and travelled to Rugby via the Leamington line. With the closing of the station, the Postmen cycled to Willoughby station with 3 or 4 bags of mail.

As the Mason Master factory developed, the number of bags rose to about 20 and were taken to Willoughby station by taxi. After a few weeks the GPO laid on the first mail vans and subsequently, with the exception of overseas parcels, Rugby Post Office collected mail directly from the factories.


Braunston Now and Then



Braunston Post Office, Money Order Office, Savings Bank and Telegraph Office at Eastrea House on The Green, run by Sarah A. Pebody from 1874 to 1906 (when she was aged 66), according to Rev. H.E. Ruddy's 1953 account of 'Braunston: as it is and as it was within living memory'. Kelly's Trade Directory of 1890 also lists her sister Jane Pebody as a postmistress. To the right is the corner of the 'Squatters Cottage' on the north side of The Green, since demolished.
