#### **New Tax Takes The Strain**

The latest offering from the small room in Whitehall responsible for innovations in stealth taxes should come as a welcome relief for all navvies who have ever put their foot in it.

The Transitional Uniform Response for Dogs Tax (TURD Tax for short) is to be fazed in over the next few years in order to encourage responsible dog ownership and reduce the incidence of unaccompanied faeces being deposited in public places.

As Lord Whiffy, minister with special responsibility for Doggy Doos, announced to a packed House, "we all know of someone who has stepped in a portion and now this government is taking firm action to stamp out this problem. The great British public want to see a clean pair of heels and no slip ups. The TURD Tax is just what the doctor ordered."

There will be an appeals system for those who feel overtaxed, independently adjudicated by Offpoop.


So we can all expect cleaner towpaths in years to come and be able to step out in style with confidence.

#### Vicar's Letter

Dear Parishioners,

Life's but a walking shadow, a poor player,

That struts and frets his hour upon the stage.

And then is heard no more:

So said Macbeth on hearing of the death of his wife in Shakespeare's great tragedy *Macbeth*. Life is shorter for some than for others. For HRH the Queen Mother it has proved longer than most. Her 100 years span the century that is just passed and she has witnessed all its great events, both its tragedies and joys. She has made a unique contribution to the life of the nation and everyone seems to have a good word for her. She has undoubtedly been the mainstay of the royal household and has earned the respect and love of millions. It is right that we should celebrate her centenary.

But there are others whose lives have not been so long. Is it therefore true to say that their lives have been the less meaningful? I am reminded of the letter written by a fighter pilot during the war which his mother received posthumously soon after the Battle of Britain had begun. In it he re-echoes the sentiment behind Shakespeare's words - life is 'but a walking shadow' If this is the case, then whether we live to forty or one hundred doesn't make that much difference - our lifespan remains just the tiniest flicker in the history of time. He goes on to say, then, that it is not length of years that matter, rather it is the measure of a person's sacrifice that really makes a difference. In the case of that fighter pilot who died so young, his sacrifice is still effective today through the peace and freedom that we enjoy.

And it is still the case today. It is not the length of a life that is important, rather it is the character of that life that makes the difference, and character is developed not through pursuing self-interest, but through dedication to a cause and through determination to do the right thing in all circumstances. Such an approach to life will inevitably result in making sacrifices but those who follow this path will be making the world a better place for others.

So we give thanks for the Queen Mother's life and we remember those less famous, who have also made a unique contribution to our national life.

### Consumer Affairs

Enjoy your holidays but don't be taken in by Timeshare salesmen! Previous problems caused by some holiday time share companies using hard-sell tactics led to the introduction of legislation that gives consumers a cooling off period in which to cancel an agreement. In an effort to get round this, some companies have devised the 'points' holiday scheme which involves buying points that can be traded in for foreign holidays.. Not a bad idea in itself but the Timeshare Act does not cover these contracts. So, if you do sign such an agreement, but later change your mind, it is unlikely you will be able to cancel it.

Don't let yourself be pressured into signing agreements. Make sure you read and understand the small print!

\* Does your Pooch need a Passport?

It is now possible to take your pet to some places overseas and return without quarantine but the pet must have certificates for vaccinations and treatments and must be fitted with a microchip. Details available by phone during office hours on 0870 241 1710

\* Extra protection for Defective Purchases.

If you buy a present for someone they will now have the same contractual rights as if they had bought the item themselves. The law changed in May so it is worth telling the retailer that the item is a present when you buy it and now the recipient will be able to resolve any problems without your help.

\* Small Claims Court Access
Easier

Last year's changes in procedures for the Small Claims Court put off some consumers because of having to pay an allocation fee of £80. Due to pressure from consumer organisations the fee has now been scrapped.
