

#### Vicar's Letter

#### Dear friends,

One of the joys of having a long holiday is there is an opportunity to get really involved in a good book. In my childhood and teenage years I would digest 'Swallows and Amazons' or the latest in Malcolm Saville's books or CS Lewis. Perhaps you remember when 'Alice in Wonderland' first came out? There is something about reading rather than watching- there is plenty of scope for the imagination to extend her wings and take flight! Of course the summer holiday has co-incided nicely with the release of JK Rowling's sixth book 'Harry Potter and the half-blood Prince' The world of magic- whether it be in Harry Potter, Alice in Wonderland or CS Lewis- is harmless enough in that it takes us into another world







#### Garden Area

#### **Report and Invitation**

Over the last two months and during our first work day in July we have been clearing much of the unwanted tree and sapling growth in the garden area at the top of the park. Overgrown elderberries and other self- seeded treelets have gone to open up the area. There are several dead trees that may well have disappeared by the time you read this article. Thanks to the brave souls who have plunged into the thickets and attacked the jungle.

The next task is to clear the undergrowth: brambles, scrub and tangled grasses and the mass of nettles at the top of the field and in the old woodland area. We would welcome any help and have arranged a work party from 9am to midday on Saturday 6th August. Undergrowth has to be cut and piled in heaps and cut tree branches dragged to other piles. Useful tools would be secateurs, loppers, rakes, slashers, petrol strimmers and saws. Gloves are needed as well as stout footwear and goggles for strimmer work. This time the work is too rough to involve children.

Please take the utmost care for yourself and other workers and identify the person with the first aid box.

#### From the Archives

## From Issue No 307 - August 1997 "Village Notes by Dick Herne

The Quality of life in the village was much improved by the development of main services in the 1930's. Electric light replaced oil lamps in houses along the High Street. New Council houses, opened in 1939, had electric light, piped water and sanitation. Many of the old cottages were occupied by evacuees during the war.

After the war sewerage works were constructed and mains water replaced wells and street pumps in the village. New houses were built in Archer Avenue (named after an active local councillor), School Close, and on the Green. Private housing developed along Back Lane - renamed Church Road. The increase of population made a larger school essential and this was opened in 1968 on a new site in Barby Lane."
