



## **Braunston Parish Council** Budget 2001/2002

At its annual budget meeting held on 15 November 2000 the Parish Council agreed a budget for the year ending 31 March 2002 of £34,500. Of this amount approximately £7,200 will come from the council's reserves. £25,000 will be requested as precept (Council Tax). The precept amount has remained the same for the last three years. The remainder of the forecast spending will be paid for from other sources of Parish Council income which it is estimated will be £2,300.

It is expected that council spending in the year 2001/2002 will be as shown below. The areas of spending and the amounts spent can change as the year progresses depending on circumstances at the time.
