Braunston Walkers

Saturday 19/11/2005 Kilsby Walk (10 -12 Miles)

Just about perfect weather for a walk, cold, frosty and sunny, greeted us as we set off from the village hall. The early morning mist was already being burnt off as we walked the footpath from Ashby Road across the fields of rape to the Barby Road just below Fir Tree Farm. The ground was hard underfoot after two or three nights of heavy frost. The hedgerows sparkled in the sun as we walked up the hill along the road past the medieval village site of Fawcliff below Braunson Cleves and up to join the road into Barby. Avoiding the construction vehicles, resurfacing the road, we continued to the cross roads and branched off past the partially frozen fishing lake and the old mill

We continued along the frozen track skirting around the side of Barby Hill and joined the road. The radio towers at Kilsby looked like they were floating in mid air in the mist. We then walked to the Oxford canal at Wood Bridge and along the towpath under the M45 and then under Norman Bridge which is Barby Lane. The canal was frozen in places and where the towpath was badly eroded we narrowly avoided a swim. Along this stretch of canal are some small gardens with boat docks that looked lovingly tended by their owners.

We finally arrived at Tarry's Bridge on the Rugby Road to Kilsby. Taking our life into our hands we walked at the side this fast stretch of road with views of the DIRFT buildings across the fields and then down into Kilsby itself.

Kilsby is a surprisingly large village and we found our way past the Red Lion pub and then past an old cobb wall and into the churchyard. We arrived at the George Pub where the welcome was warm, mainly

because we had removed our boots on Phillip's advice. The baguettes went down well as did the pint of Tinners ale from Cornwall and after a well earned rest we set off again out of the village on a footpath bridge over the M45 and across frozen fields to the road known as The Ridgeway where a friendly dog let us know that he was not happy that we were near his masters house.

We set off past Ashby Home Woods and the beautiful lake. This estate was recently acquired by the crown commission and we speculated that Prince Charles or even Prince William could one day be visiting. The many pheasants scattered like headless chickens just in case we were a shooting party.

The footpath then goes directly across a ploughed field and past the sadly non existent Cocked Hat Spinney that is shown on the map even though the trees have long since gone. We walked around the field to avoid the worst of the mud. By now the sun was dropping fast and some of the field that had had no sun were still heavily frosted.

We arrived at the A361 at Ashby St Ledger and after scraping the mud off our boots we set off up the Jurassic Way footpath towards Braunston. Jane pointed out the flat Scotch thistle and the tall Sow thistle in the fields. It was four o'clock and rapidly getting dark as we arrived back in the village after an exellent walk.


