Vicar's letter

Do you have a favourite Christmas carol?

Mine is *Hark The Herald*. It's got everything – it's only 3 verses, it's full of angels, and (best of all) it has a descant!

But there's another Christmas carol that's been running through my mind lately, particularly the words:

The hopes and fears of all the years

Are met in Thee tonight.

At the time of writing, Jeremy Hunt has just delivered his Autumn statement. We have a cost of living crisis, more and more people needing foodbanks, a war is raging in Ukraine, on top of the things we usually see in the world that just aren't right.

As we approach Christmas 2022, there seems to be a lot more fear around than hope. How much pressure is still there to 'celebrate'? Is that realistic?

For me, the hope that helps with the fear is the tiny, mewling, vulnerable baby that we sing about in Christmas carols like *O Little Town Of Bethlehem*. This baby was God coming into this mess of a world to be with us.

One of the key words of Christmas for Christians is 'Emmanuel' which means 'God with us.'

So why doesn't he just sort it out? I believe that he did, in part, and will come back to complete the job.

Why is he taking so long to come back? I often ask him that myself!

But in the meantime, we are not alone. And in the meantime, the way we respond to this crisis has a bigger effect. I found an extra verse to

O Little Town on the internet and it is really rather beautiful:

Where charity stands watching And faith holds wide the door The dark night wakes, the glory breaks And Christmas comes once more.

Couldn't we do with some glory breaking in? And so, I will continue to sing with added passion this year:

O Holy Child of Bethlehem Descend to us, we pray Cast out our sin and enter in Be born in us today.

We hear the Christmas angels The great glad tidings tell O come to us, abide with us Our Lord Emmanuel!

Perhaps you share this hope, perhaps you don't. My appeal to all of us, whatever our beliefs, is to take the pressure off ourselves to 'celebrate' on the surface with all the trappings. What we need is community and charity. Charity means love — it's certainly nothing to be ashamed of if you need to receive it. We can't do this alone. If you have more than you need, pop some things in the community store cupboard in the church. If you don't have enough, pop in and take what you need. I'm here if you need a chat.

We don't have to do this alone. That's something to celebrate.

Christmas tree on The Green

We have funded a Christmas tree again this year for the Village Green which will arrive at the beginning of December.

Jetty Field Trees

The Jetty Field Committee reported the findings of tests undertaken on the poplar trees in the spinney. These show that several trees are rotting and need felling to keep the area safe. The Parish Council agreed funding to support this. We await quotations for the work.

Village Hall Defibrillator

A request was made by the Village Hall Committee for part funding of a defibrillator to be sited outside the building. This was agreed and will bring the number of defibrillators in the village up to five.

Braunston Heart requested funding to secure the continuation of Cosy Club. It was agreed to fund a period to take it up to a review and then consider the request again at the next meeting.

This advent, Braunston Climate Action Network is sharing a daily invitation to act on the climate crisis. Our Advent Calendar will be on our Facebook page – Braunston Climate Action Network and Twitter @braunstonaction

In our November meeting we discussed an air quality monitoring project that a Braunston student at Parker school would like to take on for the Duke of Edinburgh's Award Scheme. We also reviewed our work to get EV charging points in Braunston, the costs and benefits of home batteries as well as our other Braunston projects. Our meeting notes are on our webpage in the 'Village Info' section of the village website under 'Climate Emergency', and our Facebook page. These projects have a direct impact on carbon emissions and climate as well as bringing co-benefits that will come with the post-fossil fuel age.

Jetty Field

Regular users of Jetty Field may have noticed some trees with red numbers on their trunks. Unfortunately, the poplars in Jetty Field are at the end of their natural life. Test reports on the trees have shown that they have considerable trunk decay. The advice we have been given is that the trees should be felled. The Parish Council has agreed and due to safety concerns the trees will be felled as soon as we have received up to date quotes for the work.

Removing the decaying poplars will also give us the opportunity to replant with more suitable native species to regenerate the spinney.

The work is likely to take place early in 2023 before the leaves have started to grow and birds have started nesting.

Whilst this work is undertaken, access to Jetty Field will be restricted. We will endeavour to keep you up to date with the actual period of work, which is likely to take five days. Please be aware that during this time heavy machinery will be moving around the site.

Second Braunston Brownies

Braunston Walkers

Saturday 19/11/22 walk to Barby

On a cold, but thankfully sunny dry day, eleven of us started this walk, along Greenway into Countryside and at the bottom we squeezed through the gap by the gate to enter fields of long wet grass beyond. The horses were uninterested in us as we passed by. At the bottom of this field there is a footbridge over a stream, but a tree has fallen to create an obstacle course, which we clambered through. The field beyond rises steeply up to two wonky stiles. The public footpath then goes over several more fields and stiles, one with no crossbeam which has been reported on Street Doctor but still not repaired. One of the stiles was like a quagmire that needed to be traversed! Clinging to the metal gate we made it through. The fields go beneath Tiltup's Holt Farm before bringing you to a small wood and beyond you emerge onto the road by the water tower at Barby. Your Café Grants Fund



Although the original community

café known as 'Your Café' ceased trading in July 2021, we have continued to allocate grants from the remaining funds to village groups and societies for projects. Prior to closure and since we began in 2015, we had given grants totalling £18,475 in response to 47 successful applications; a great legacy. These were across 25 different village groups and societies, including the Pocket Park, Playing Fields, Friendly Club, Scouts, Village Hall, Cinema Club, Football Club, Cricket Club, Youth Club and BVGA.

In the past year, we have paid out almost £4600 across seven applications, with a further two applications totalling £1600 committed but not yet drawn. This makes a total of 56 successful applications totalling £24,675 over the past 8 years.

Some examples for 2022 include funds granted for the BVGA to buy planters and plants for the Village Hall car park; a mower for the Cricket Club; part-funding for the Scouts to convert camp equipment to LED lighting; a defibrillator for the Village Hall and a contribution towards the new Community Car. The maximum grant is £1000 and currently £4793 remains available for grants.

Our constitution is on the Braunston village website along with the grant application form. You can find us by searching under 'Clubs & Societies' and we are listed in various sections including charities, community and volunteers.




