
VE/VJ 60TH ANNIVERSARY







Star Singer In Forgotten Country Church

James Bowman - famous across the globe for his sublime singing and featured artist on countless discs — is making a most unusual appearance on Sunday 3 July when he performs in the isolated country church of Wolfhamcote, between Flecknoe and Braunston. Bowman has sung in opera houses from San Francisco to Sydney, Glyndebourne to La Scala Milan. He has received honours from both the French government and from the Queen, but he can surely seldom have performed in such a majestically desolate church as St Peter's, Wolfhamcote.

Uniquely atmospheric, the redundant church is just about all that remains of the deserted mediæval village of Wolfhamcote. St Peter's has a superb mediæval wooden screen, as well as the Royal Coat of Arms of Queen Anne, dating from 1702, which hangs in its original position over the chancel arch. The only pews are some antiquated benches and electricity is never likely to reach this ancient place! So everyone involved in the concert is hoping for a warm, light evening....

Bowman is joining Northamptonshire-based Fiori Musicali for this concert which forms part of Fiori's popular summer season of concerts. On the bill of fare for July 3 is music by a little-known English renaissance composer Robert Whyte, sometime master of the choristers of Ely cathedral (where James Bowman himself was once a choirboy). Fiori's choir will be performing Whyte's poignant setting of the Lamentations of Jeremiah and violinist Andrea Morris is set to play brilliant Italian violin music from the early 17th century. Already tickets for the concert are selling fast.

All in all, this looks like a must for music lovers - clearly a concert not to be missed (further information from 01327 361380 or on Fiori's web site www.fiori-musicali.com). Tickets are available from Classic Concerts Box Office 0870 116 2110 or directly from The Braunston Village Stores. Concert begins at 7.00 pm at St Peter's, Wolfhamcote on Sunday 3 July. "Braunston on V.E Day 1945"

"Friendly Club members recall how flags and bunting soon appeared in many home and shops. (Braunston had more and varied shops in those days) Some homes even had "Welcome Home" banners for the few lads lucky enough to get early leave. Food was rationed and in short supply but everything was pooled to provide sandwiches, cake, sausage rolls etc. for a Village Party which was held in the Memorial Hall. This used to stand where Ray Hollis' bungalow has now been built at the top of High Street. The present Village Hall was still being used as the Village School with Duncan Gallie as Headmaster.

In the evening, the piano was manhandled from "The Sheaf" onto the Green and Donny Wythall proceeded to play until the small hours. Everyone joined in the singing and dancing with plenty of beer to go round. Although many of the young men were still away in Germany or in the Far East, the whole country was feeling optimistic for the future"

"Braunston V.E.Day Commemorations 1995 (50th Anniversary)

There was a VE Day party night at The Plough on Saturday 6 May, with fireworks at dusk. There was a continuation at The Plough on Sunday evening. In Church, the Royal British Legion attended evensong at 6.30pm on 7th May to remember both V.E and V.J Days."
