Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

As I look out of the Rectory Study window-there is a layer of snow on the ground.

Imagine for a moment I have a spade. And I write three words in the snow.

'NO' 'YES' 'HELLO'

Your immediate reaction might be to reach for the phone and think 'She's flipped!'

But actually those three words help to sum up what Lent, Good Friday and Easter are all about. In Lent, we try, with God's help to say 'No' to acts which are unhelpful and unhealthy- acts which separate us from other people and God.

'Yes' is to accepting the fact that on our own we aren't able to help ourselves and we need help from another. We say 'Yes' to the one who is able to help us. Sin is like rubbish in a dump yard- it piles up and separates us from God. Jesus' death on the cross was a way of clearing a gap in the wall- so that we can say 'Yes' to God and enter into a relationship with God. This is only because 'God' is passionate about us and has said 'Yes' to us.

'Hello' is 'hello' to others in the same boat. That's what we do in Church and as we meet fellow Christians. Christians aren't different- they are just folk who have realised their need for a Saviour, and are thankful.

There is much on offer at Church as Easter approaches. It is an opportunity to say 'Yes' to the One who has said 'Yes' to us.



VILLAGE HALL NEWS

HAVE YOU A SKILL, OR SOME TIME FOR US?

We have been fortunate over the years to find village people to volunteer to help us, either on a regular or casual basis. Sometimes they have professional or employment skills that the Management Committee find particularly useful. For instance, a parent of a Youth Club attendee turned out to be an expert in Health and Safety, and volunteered to carry out a Health and Safety Audit for the Village Hall, a statutory obligation in this day and age; we have had the expert services of a Building Surveyor on our committee for several years, which enabled us to carry out the recent improvements to a much higher standard, and at a quicker rate, than would have been possible without him; and we have a volunteer handyman who does the smaller repair and maintenance jobs for free, thus saving the Village Hall quite a lot of money.

The Village Hall plays a large part in the community spirit within the village, but demands a large amount of attention, and money, to ensure that it is kept safe and up to date. It needs to be financially viable, and needs to be marketed to ensure that we maximize its income. Many people who have recently moved to the village would like to contribute to our community life, but do not know how to go about it. We are only to pleased to welcome new blood and new initiatives. For that matter, old blood is welcome too!

Anti-Social Behaviour Order

The Parish Council in conjunction with Daventry Police and Daventry District Council have managed to secure a Section 30 Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003 order on the following area of the village (in a sort of triangle area, covering the village hall and the walkways behind, the bus stop and the bench outside the Wheatsheaf PH).

The facts about the Act and the powers available to the Police are listed below however it must be stressed that any incidents have to be reported to the Police (Phone 01327 300300). When phoning in any incidents you just need to state that the Juvenile Nuisance is taking place within the Section 30 area.

<u>Powers: Section 30 Anti-Social Behaviour Act 2003 (sub sections 3 to 6).</u>

If an Officer IN UNIFORM has reasonable grounds for believing that the presence or behaviour of a group of 2 or more persons in any public place in the relevant locality has resulted, or is likely to result, in any members of the public being intimidated, harassed, alarmed or distressed:

The constable may give one or more of the following directions, namely:

- a) a direction requiring the person(s) in the group to disperse (either immediately or by such time as he may specify and in such way as he may specify);
- a direction requiring any of those person(s) whose place of residence is not within the relevant locality to leave he relevant locality or any part of the relevant locality (either immediately or by such time as he may specify and in such way as he may specify);
- a direction prohibiting any of those person(s) whose place of residence is not within the relevant locality from returning to the relevant locality or any part of the relevant locality for such period (not exceeding 24 hours) from the giving of the direction as he may specify;

- * NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN THAT FAILURE TO COMPLY WITH AN OFFICERS INSTRUCTIONS GIVEN UNDER THE ABOVE POWERS MAY CONSTITUTE AN OFFENCE FOR WHICH THE OFFENDER MAY BE ARRESTED. THESE POWERS MAY ALSO BE EXERCISED BY POLICE COMMUNITY SUPPORT OFFICERS.

From March 1970 - No 3

"Villagers will be interested to know that after many years, definite progress is at last being made towards providing the new Village Hall. The Village Hall Management Committee has agreed to buy the former Church of England School site, and the purchase will be completed shortly.

This is regarded as the most suitable site in the Village, as it is large and central. The committee is particularly pleased that it has been able to obtain this site, with the active assistance of the Rector (The Rev W Bevan Griffiths), as it is the only undeveloped land in the Village within easy access of all parts, and should prove a valuable asset for future generations.

The existing buildings will be substantially altered and improved. The project is being financed by the Village Hall fund which has accumulated over the years, and with the help of a Government Grant."
