



Spring and Lent

The month of March begins with Shrove Tuesday, which this year is the first of March and it also happens to be St. David's Day, a fact that all loyal Welsh men and women would know. Shrove Tuesday is also known as Pancake Day, where we fill ourselves up with pancakes in readiness for forty days of fasting and what a good meal they make. In the early days they were made of food that would only be wasted, if not used before the fast began. There is a debate every year as to whether pancakes should be accompanied with oranges or lemons, we all have our preferences. The first of March also indicates the start of Lent where John the Baptist commenced his time of forty days in the wilderness wearing a loin cloth and surviving on a diet of honey and locusts. The honey is fine in fact very good, but I'm not so sure about the locusts! Today, some of us use the period of Lent as a time when we give up certain foods which should be our favourites, often in the form of biscuits or cake, which can help with a diet, if one is needed. It is also a time for reflection. It is time for nature to come to life. Bulbs are beginning to show in our gardens, with well-loved snow drops, daffodils and crocus well to the fore. We see new buds forming in the hedge rows and on trees and bushes. It is also the traditional time when new life is shown in the form of lambs, racing and skipping in the fields. The wildlife such as birds and wild animals all recognise it is their time to begin new life. It is also time for grass to start growing again and with it, the familiar sound of lawn mowers munching their way up and down the lawns in the neighbourhood. We are, as well, weather permitting, used to the smell of outside cooking. It should be remembered that all these easily recognised events, smells and sounds lead us to a very important festival namely Easter.

Over those 2 years we have supported many individuals and families with home cooked meals and treats, weekly fresh and dried foods, and extra treats at Christmas and Easter to help make things a little easier in difficult times. None of this would be possible without the continued generosity of our supporters. We have been fortunate to have the support of Reverend Nat and Pete who kindly gave over most of their garage to house the project and who have supported so many in need over that time. It was never intended to be a long term facility but it continues to be regularly used.

The Foodshare is a valuable resource for the village and visitors and to ensure it can continue we have now secured a permanent home inside the church where it will become a community larder.



Braunston Canal Society (BCS)

A crew of 9 turned out for the first scheduled task party of the year. 'Skippy' was used to transport 2 totem sign posts and postcrete from the Stop House to the pound above bottom lock. It had been noticed that the disused culvert above lock 1 was being used as a litter bin. Splitting into 2 teams, a team of 4 set about clearing out the culvert while the other team cleared last year's growth from the lock side garden at lock 1. The totem signs were installed and lock maintenance performed on locks 1,2 & 3. Once again "Skippy" proved to be a valuable asset transporting materials, equipment, crew and finally the arisings to the composting site at Union Canal Carriers.



The second task party in January saw a team tackle the longstanding problem of a spring flooding the towpath above the Nelson lock. The flow was captured underground and channeled under the towpath into the canal. In addition, lock maintenance was completed on locks 4,5 & 6, litter was collected from the offside at the tunnel portal, the drain pipes that run under the raised section of towpath between top lock and the tunnel were rodded and the weir at Nelson lock was cleared of vegetation.

Naming Storms - has your name ever been chosen for a storm?

On the 1st September 2021 the Met Office, Met Eireann, and KNMI announced the storm names they have selected from over 10,000 submissions put forward by the UK public. The names chosen reflect the diversity of the UK, Ireland and the Netherlands.

The 2021-22 season runs from September through to the end of August, the first storm named this season was Arwen and by 21st February 2022 we have reached storm Franklin. In line with US National Hurricane Centre naming conventions, there are no storms for Q, U, X, Y and Z.

Whilst names of storms can be thought to be light-hearted, their impacts can be severe. Storms will be named when they are deemed to cause medium or high impacts in the UK, Ireland or the Netherlands. In addition to strong winds, impacts from rain and snow are also considered.

First introduced by the Met Office and Met Éireann (Ireland's National Meteorological Service) in 2015, the Name our Storms campaign has helped raise awareness of the potential impacts of severe weather in Britain and Ireland before it hits. In 2019, the Royal Netherlands Meteorological Institute (KNMI), the Dutch national weather forecasting service, joined the collaboration.
