Increase in Computer and Information Provision

As part of an innovative programme of increased computer access to residents of Braunston the Parish Council is to employ an Information Officer. He is Nick Thompson. Nick will be present in the Village Hall library from 6-30pm to 9-30pm every Thursday. The scheme is for an initial period of six months. At the end of this time it will be extended or not depending on the use made of the provision.

There will be help for anyone with any aspect of computer or Internet use. Assistance will be for either individuals or groups who want to produce documents or posters.

Computers are an increasingly useful tool in finding information on virtually any subject. Nick will help anyone who wants access to information; in particular those who are looking for information about services which are available locally.

One of the reasons for the provision of computers in the village is to help those who either can't or don't wish to travel. It is now possible to contact the outside world without going further than the Village Hall Library.

Internet Access has been available in the Village Hall on Thursdays for just over a year. Because of its success the service will be extended to Tuesday evenings from 6-00pm to 8-00pm in addition to Thursday evenings.

The expansion in the service has been made possible by the generosity of village resident Peter Andrews whose donation has provided for the purchase of a 'state of the art' multimedia computer and peripherals.


In addition to word processing, spreadsheet, database and Internet access software, the Village Hall computers will also carry software designed to help those looking for employment opportunities or training related to employment. Local Information Advice and Guidance will provide this specialised software as part of its joint working programme with the Parish Council.

Action in the event of break in water supply

During a recent break in the water supply Anglian Water provided bottled water but did not inform villagers of this. As a result some made do without water and some bought bottled supplies. The Parish Council brought this matter to the attention of the water company and has received an explanation and apology.

One paragraph of the letter may be of interest for the future.

"In the event of a burst main in the future, Anglian Water will provide bottled water on request but our first priority is to our vulnerable customers, such as the disabled and elderly. This can be requested by contacting our customer care line on 08457 145 145. Following this, a careful assessment on further deployment of mass stocks of bottled water must then be made against the anticipated time of repair to prevent the unnecessary diversion of resources."


Braunston Village Garden's Association

As Area Development Worker for LIAG I am running informal drop-in sessions in the Village Hall Library twice a month on Friday mornings, whilst children are attending pre-school.
