

The Village Bells.

On Friday 21st October you may have heard the church bells ringing at mid-day, celebrating the 200th anniversary of the Battle of Trafalgar. There's not much doubt that they would have been ringing for the same event 200 years ago, because throughout England the ringing of bells has always signalled significant national events This of course is additional to the regular task of ringing for church services. In town and village alike this has been a part of our English heritage for well over 400 years. It is even probable that our church bells rang out to announce the victory over the Spanish Armada.

Bells need ringers, a minimum of one per bell, and ideally we need sufficient ringers to cover for holidays and other absences. Occasionally our numbers are reduced and we have vacancies for new learners. English bell ringing is not only a fascinating individual skill, it leads to close team work and a social bond with ringers throughout the country. Learners' ages range from school children to retired persons. However, in the case of young persons, parental support is needed.

At Braunston we are recognised as a teaching centre and hold dedicated sessions for learners. To find more of this interesting activity give Peter Wenham a call on 891935 – or come along to our ringing practice at 7.30 p.m. on Thursdays.

October in Jetty Field

The clearance of the garden area is now complete and the outlines of the pond and stream have reappeared. This has been achieved entirely with volunteers and the result is truly magnificent. The woodland area is also open and the rough undergrowth cut down. The field nettles and brambles have been mowed down and a second hay crop removed as we begin to re-establish the meadow flowers and grasses. Tenders have gone out to cover work that is necessary on the trees of all these areas. We now have to reinstate field boundaries and upgrade the entrances, particularly at the top and bottom of the field to enhance our part of the Jurassic Way.

The next task is to consider the final two areas of the whole project on the west of the woodland triangle where the allotments used to be. We have opened up a way to let us do some detailed surveying and the approaching winter will give us time to get in expert advice on the protection on an amazing collection of wild life that has developed in this area over the years of human inactivity. But we ask that everyone keeps out of this area until plans are complete and we can take the necessary steps to do the right thing. The temporary opening will have a fence running across it that we ask you not to cross. Part of the survey includes the possibility of setting up allotments and we will invite those who have expressed an interest to a meeting soon.

There are many and varied opportunities to apply for grants and awards to improve places like Jetty Field which can be added to monies that the parish Council can make available. So we have an unusual suggestion. The management committee would like to recruit another member whose only task would be to prepare applications and presentations for a selection of possible grants. When we say "only" we realise that this word hides the sustained effort required to produce applications but someone might be willing to consider it if they knew that there were no huge committee meetings to attend or any other duties to perform. Guidance will be given and information provided as required and the work could be completed at home. If you would like to discuss this important contribution to village life and future then please phone Pat Herlihy on 01788 890590.

We need time to consider and plan. An event is planned for December but Carol will be contacting the volunteers nearer that time. Braunston Walkers

Saturday 15 Oct 2005 Norton Junction (approx 12 Miles)

Nine intrepid walkers met at the village hall with the weather doing a fair impression of July. Sunny intervals and warm, certainly not autumnal. Phillip described the route and off we set up the Jurassic Way footpath out of the village and steadily up hill. At 175 metres we paused to look back at the village with the Warwickshire plain as a back drop. Unfortunately the haze meant that all we could see was the village itself, anything beyond that disappeared.

Crossing the Barby road we rejoined the footpath towards Ashby St Ledger. Jane pointed out all the toadstools in the field which had been named "tubs of lard" one, because the species was not shown in the book and two, to make them sound unappetising less anyone tried eating them and suffered dire consequences.

The A361 is currently closed for resurfacing and the workers kindly moved their barrow of hot asphalt so that our procession didn't knock it over. We crossed the road, avoiding the huge trucks delivering tarmac and arrived in Ashby St Ledger passing the pub that has now reopened after recent refurbishment. It being a little too early for a drink we decided to visit the church with its triple decker, Jacobean pulpit and ancient stained glass windows. It is a fascinating church, full of harvest festival bounty, built in mellow Northamptonshire stone and standing next to the manor house once owned by the Catesby family of gunpowder plot fame.

In the village we also spotted on one of the pretty thatched cottages the usual peacock and the more unusual jet airliner both made of thatch.

The footpath continued over, thankfully, dry fields to Welton and on out of the village on the road over Crockwell Hill from where we joined a footpath across the fields to Welton Hythe Marina on the Grand Union Canal. The trees here displayed fantastic autumnal reds and oranges as we turned south along the canal.

At this point two of our braver members decided to swing on a rope tied to a tree branch out over the canal. The rope held and nobody got wet so we continued to Norton Junction which has a sign showing Brentford at 89 miles and Leicester at 41 miles. Crossing the canal on a lock by the A5 we had our first catastrophe. The pub was not serving food as its kitchen was being refurbished. Not even sandwiches were available and we didn't fancy loads of crisps so a vote was taken and a detour made to visit the White Horse at Norton. In view of the lateness we set off at a blistering pace at first on the B4036 and then on a gated road arriving to a warm welcome at the pub. The sandwiches, beer and welcome were all excellent and we sat outside in the sun for a well earned rest.

We then collectively decided to detour along the road to Daventry before we rejoined the path down to the canal towpath towards the Braunston tunnel. Hedgerows shone with the scarlet of rose hips together with blackberries and sloes. Good for making Sloe Gin. At the tunnel entrance the stench of diesel and lights dancing on the water reflected a queue of boats emerging. We followed the path, used by the horses that used to pull the barges and walked over the top of the 1875 metre tunnel. Next to tunnel airshafts we could see the welcoming site of Braunston and we continued along the canal and up into the village and home for a comforting cuppa!

THE PRICE OF VANDALISM

Wanton vandalism by a small number of village youngsters, is costing every household in the village money. Whilst willing volunteers have been working hard to create an attractive garden area at JettyField for everyone to enjoy, youngsters have been destroying what was a lovely old summerhouse. Doors and windows have been removed and destroyed, roof tiles smashed, the pond filled in with debris, the list goes on. The cost of the damage to date is estimated at £4,000.

The Parish Council now has to make the decision whether or not to invest money in refurbishing the building and risk further damage and nuisance to neighbours, or to just demolish what remains of the building.


On the Playing Field recently installed benches have been damaged and expensive play equipment for young children has been so badly vandalised that it has had to be removed. All this equipment was funded by the village. The Village Hall is regularly under attack by youths throwing stones and breaking windows, causing a drain on recourses that could have been used to further improve the facilities.

The Village Green Bus Shelter is constantly having to be repainted due to graffiti and damage by footballs.

Unbelievably even our Church has been subjected to vandalism. The Parish Council is working closely with the Police to try to prevent damage and abusive behaviour by the few youngsters that are causing the problems but we are now having to look at the cost of installing CCTV cameras in vulnerable parts of the village. Money that would otherwise be used on much needed village improvements and projects.

Everyone can help to prevent this unnecessary drain on the Parish precept by reporting any vandalism or abusive behaviour to the police immediately it occurs. Your call will be dealt with confidentially. The number to ring is 01327 300300

Parents in particular can help by making sure they know where their children are and by explaining to them that any damage they cause will cost their Mum or Dad money.
