Welton Road Play Area Closed Due to Vandalism

The police have been informed of two recent episodes of vandalism damage at Welton Road Play Area. The Parish Council is hopeful that the culprits will be caught in the near future.

One item of equipment has been damaged beyond repair and a swing seat has been partially detached from the chains making it unsafe for use. In addition Tipp-Ex has been smeared over a number of items. As a result of this damage the decision has been made to close the area completely in order to avoid the possibility of any injury.

The cost of repairing the damage has been estimated by Wicksteed Leisure as being £946 which is just over 70p for every adult who lives in the village.

Anyone who can give information about the damage should contact Daventry Police on 01327 300300.

Braunston Parish Council apologises to anyone who is prevented from making use of the Play Area by the silly acts of the antisocial.

Crime in Braunston

In the year April 1999 to March 2000 there were 44 reported crimes in Braunston. This is the same as the previous year. In the period April 2000 to July 2000 there have been 22 crimes of which 8 have been detected. This compares with 16 crimes in the same period last year.

Drugs 1 (1).




The Great Central ConneXion

This bus service running between Rugby and Banbury via Braunston commenced on 4 September. It has been provided by a partnership between Geoff Amos Coaches and three County Councils including Northamptonshire. It is partly funded through the government's Rural Bus Challenge.

Fruit Flower & Vegetable Show Report

A big thank you to the 37 adults & 7 junior exhibitors, 125 paying visitors, all the people who donated tombola prizes & cakes, and to the many volunteer helpers who all contributed in making this years Show a great success and such a splendid visual attraction. It was good to see so many new faces, who, as predicted, did very well in their classes. We had 278 exhibits this year, which filled the village hall.

Winner of The TUC Centenary Perpetual Trophy for the most points in the Fruit, Flower & Vegetable section, was Mr Len Jacobs with 42 points. The George Green Perpetual Challenge Trophy for the most points in Wine, Home Produce and Handicrafts was won by Mrs I Reeves with 20 points. The National Starch & Chemical's 'Busy Hands' shield for the most points gained by a junior exhibitor (under 11), was won by Sam Walsh with 12 points. Nicholas Courts was runner-up with 11 points. Special awards were won by Mr M McCarthy in the vegetable section for 6 tomatoes, Mrs A Rogers in the fruit section for Quinces, and for Mr L Jacobs in the flowers section for 3 dahlias (not pom pom). Mrs I Reeves won the special award for her dry red in the wine section, Mrs E Gwynne for her quiche in the home produce section and Mrs A Wolfenden for 'any other needlework' in the handcrafts. In the Junior section, the special prize was won by Christopher Courts for a collage made from garden flowers.

Congratulations to all these deserving winners. This successful day enabled us to cover our costs of around £275, AND make a profit of about £160, which goes to fund our various projects within the Village. Once again, a big thank you to everyone who contributed to this success.



Dear Parishioners,

THE INTERREGNUM

It was with great sadness that we said farewell to James and Rebecca on Sunday the 17th September. There was a magnificent attendance for his last service in Braunston and both were surprised by the generosity of the amount donated towards a present for them. In addition to a four volume set of a Theological Dictionary, which they will both find useful, we gave them a bottle of James' favourite wine, a book on Italian cookery and a substantial cheque. Thank you to everyone who gave so generously to this magnificent present, and to all who helped to make the farewell party so successful.

It is during an Interregnum that the benefits of being one of the Daventry Team parishes become most apparent. We already have clergy arranged to provide us with a Eucharist on every Sunday and an Evensong on the first Sunday of each month until next Easter. Every week, except when there is a Family Service, we will have our 10.30 Sunday Eucharist. It will not be possible to provide a Priest for the 8am service every week, but we are very grateful to Clive Cooper who has agreed to take this service on two Sundays each month; usually on the 2nd and 4th Sundays. Unfortunately the 10.30am Wednesday Eucharist will have to be suspended during the interregnum, but there is an alternative service available in Welton at 10am.

So it will be almost business as usual during the coming weeks. We look forward to our Harvest Festival services on Sunday 1st October and the Harvest Supper at the School on Monday 2nd. Then on 1st November we have the All Saints' Day Patronal Festival.

From Our Archive

Village Notes by

Dick Herne

April 1995

Westfield House at the west end of High Street overlooks the A45 and the Oxford canal which curves round the end of the hill on which the village stands. Clearly visible below it is the "ridge and furrow" of the medieval open field, one of three fields which sustained village life in those times.

Westfield House is a nineteenth century building that belonged to the Butlin family. One of them has a memorial in the cemetery. The hill leading from the A45 into the village used to be known as Butlin's Hill. At the bottom stood one of the tollgates on the turnpike road between Daventry and Dunchurch which opened in 1720
