I completed the GNR, together with my daughters, Emma, Hannah and Abby, together with Emma's husband Glen. It was a very warm and humid day which made it quite hard going.


Thanks to your generous donations we have raised over £2000 for Prostate cancer charity between us.

Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

As you probably know I'm not the best gardener! But on Friday I spent a lot of time in the garden. It was one of those beautiful September days - crisp, blue sky but quite cold. I was attacking the hedges. Suddenly I didn't want to be anywhere else because nature is so beautiful and it often in our gardens that we feel so close to God. Harvest has become one of those most popular times to attend Church. Why? It's a time when we want to say 'thank you' to God for His amazing generosity to us. If you just look at a plum or an apple the amount of ingenuity and creative beauty in them far supersedes anything we have created. A digital camera or mobile phone is very clever- but God's creation is just naturally absolutely amazing! I would greatly encourage you to come to Harvest-but not see it as an end in itself. God so blesses us every day with creation and family life. Church is a place to say thank you to Him.

Harvest is also a time when we need to think about 'sharing' the much that we have. We hope you will help us this year with 'Goat for it!' The money that will come from produce brought to the Family Harvest Gift Service- will then be auctioned off at the Supper on Monday 3rd October. Or you may just want to bring a gift of money. This will go towards buying goats for communities that Christian Aid has

highlighted as needing help. A goat can provide milk, dung (for the vegetables!), meat, for a community. So the nanny goat is an all-in-one answer to many problems! In next month's BVN I'll pass on how many goats both the Church and School have provided!

As you will be receiving this magazine with November in view- please also make a note in your diaries. On 1st November we celebrate our Patronal festival in the Church with a special service at 7.30pm. The following day on 2nd November at 7.30pm there is an 'All Souls' Service when we remember loved ones. Then of course the continues...with Remembering Remembrance Family Service On Sunday 13th at 11.00am and a special Remembrance Day Service with uniformed organisations and the British Legion at 3pm. You are very warmly invited to all these Services- and it would be great to see you!

AUGUST AND SEPTEMBER IN JETTY FIELD

Decades of overgrown tangles have been cleared from the garden area to reveal hidden outlines of an old plan: thanks to the 10 volunteers in July and 23 in August and 7 in September. So far we have recorded 280 hours of volunteer work in the park! Someone braved the dog fouling and mowed the entrance from the village green: thanks again. A whole swathe of thistles has been mowed from the top end of the field: thanks. And in between the planned workdays, small groups, pairs and individuals have cleared, strimmed, cut and burnt. Jetty Field re-emerges. Enjoy our field: walk the park.

The garden area is already opened and some paths are clear. A notice, warning of a possible danger from a deeper area of stagnant water in the revealed pond next to the summerhouse, has been smashed down: the potential danger remains until we can drain the water. The woodland area is surveyed and will be selectively pruned; we have taken advice from the Tree Officer of DDC. A hay cut has been taken from the field to further improve the grassland. The plans for the bird and butterfly area still have to be initiated but discussions will take place on the possibility of an allotment area.

Hedges, fences and gateways have

to be improved to give an overall impression of an area that we can be proud of and that offers the proper level of convenience and welcome. Our advisors here have been The Rights of Way Officer and the Access Officer from NCC. And overall assistance has been given by the Pocket Parks Officer from NCC and from the officers of BTCV.

We are also keen to put in rubbish and dog bins and will do so as soon as funding becomes available. It's no use grumbling about litter if we do not give everyone the chance to put their rubbish in a bin. [Then we can!] In the meantime we are putting some stout rubble sacks near the entrances and ask all users to be as careful as possible in clearing away litter and removing dog dirt. Please avoid all dog fouling in the garden area and the woodland area particularly - it is planned to invite school children into the park next year.

Please come and help at the next work day if you can, on Saturday October 1st 9am to 12. We will be welcoming Ruth Douglas of Northamptonshire Pocket Parks on that day; she will be available to answer any questions on processes and hopes for the future. Dave and Brian have been the master planners for the work days and Carol registers volunteers within the insurance cover of the Parish Council.


Hope and Homes for Children

There are more than one million children is state institutions in Eastern Europe growing up in poverty, fear and unhappiness. Millions more are orphaned by war and conflict, and there are an estimated 20 million children orphaned by HIV/AIDS in Africa. Hope and Homes for Children is working at the heart of this global humanitarian crisis.

We work with local authorities to move children from large institutions to small family homes, we reunite child refugees with relatives after war or conflict and we support desperate young mothers who may otherwise abandon their babies. In all of this our Mission remain the same:

To give hope to the poorest children in the world – those who are orphaned abandoned, or vulnerable – by enabling them to grow up within the love of a family and the security of a home, so they can fulfil their potential.

"During the summer holiday we have had a host of visitors. The Bishop of South Carolina came before attending the Lambeth Conference of Bishops. On July 30th, 40 young people from the Christian Youth Fellowship Association came again. The Fellowship gathers young people from all parts of England. We also had a group from Reading University, and on August 13th there was a large party from Germany at the 8 am Communion service.

We are apt to feel downcast sometimes on the way some of the young people of our country are going, but when young people on holiday can make the effort to come to Church it gives us all a new hope for our Country.

It was 11 young men and Christ who turned the world upside down - this we often forget."
