# Rev'd James Watson to leave Braunston

It is time to say goodbye to our Vicar. After five years in Braunston, James and Rebecca are moving on - they arrived here from Newcastle in September 1995.

James has been appointed as Vicar of Saint Anne's, Woodplumpton, in the Diocese of Blackburn. Woodplumpton lies just north of Preston (close to the M55 to Blackpool). The parish consists of Woodplumpton village, a couple of hamlets and a sizeable new housing estate on the borders of Preston. Woodplumpton is similar to Braunston in that it has the Lancaster Canal running through it, otherwise it is quite different; the church is a comparatively low-rise building and has no spire or steeple!

James' last service in Braunston will be on 17th September at 10.30 am when he will celebrate the Eucharist for the last time as Team Vicar. Later that same day, at 6.30 pm at Holy Cross, Daventry he will make his farewell to the Daventry Team at the Songs of Praise service. All are welcome to attend these services.

Woodplumpton has made a general invitation to Braunston to attend James' Institution and Induction there on Thursday 12th October. Those making the 150 mile journey are assured of a warm welcome.

Rebecca has been appointed as Lecturer in Biblical Studies at St. Martin's College, Lancaster, a post held in conjunction with that of Senior Tutor on the Carlisle and Blackburn Diocesan Training Institute. Her duties begin on 1st October when she will be teaching undergraduates (at St. Martin's) and candidates for ordination (at the Training Institute). She has always enjoyed the teaching opportunities that arose while living in Braunston and looks forward to teaching on a full-time basis. At the same time Rebecca hopes to achieve her doctorate when she submits her thesis in the near future.

It may be several months before a new Vicar is appointed to Braunston and the Churchwardens and the Parochial Church Council will have a heavy burden to carry. Fortunately, we are one of the seven parishes of the Daventry team ministry and so can look forward to support from the other priests.

Thank you James and Rebecca for all you have done in Braunston and best wishes for your future success and happiness in Woodplumpton!


# Crick keeps the 'Braunston' Boat Show

# Braunston Village Show - your chance to show off!

The schedules are out, and we hope that many people who have never entered a Show before will have a try this year. Whilst the Braunston Show is judged to RHS standards, it is staged for fun, and to encourage those amongst us who can cook or sew a bit, or who enjoy gardening, and it gives a little competitive edge. If you think you might like to have a go, but are not quite sure what to do then this next bit is for you.

First, study the schedule and decide which classes you will enter and complete the entry form including name and address. This has to be taken to the Post Office or 29 Spinney Hill by **6.00 pm on Wednesday**, **6**<sup>th</sup> **September**, with the entry fees (10p per class for adults). There should only be one name per form. Further entry forms can be obtained from Braunston Post Office.

Most of the entries will need to be fresh, so Friday and early Saturday morning are normally quite hectic as you try and assemble your exhibits. Stick rigidly to the instructions for each class. From 8.30 a.m. on the morning of the show, the hall is open for entrants. You arrive and obtain your class numbers from the Show Secretary, and then find the correct tables on which to display your exhibits. You have until 10.30 a.m. to arrive, at which time the doors are closed. Staging must be completed by 11.00, when judging commences. Judging takes about two hours.

At 2.00 the public is admitted, and you can then look to see whether or not you have been successful, and collect any winnings. The best entry in each section is awarded a special prize. There are also three cups awarded for competitors with the most points.

Don't think that, as you have never entered before, you'll stand no chance of winning. You would be surprised at the number of 'first-timers' who get first places. Have a go, and Good Luck.

# **Speedwatch**

#### What is it?

It is a community anti-speeding initiative set up by Northamptonshire ACRE (Action with Communities in Rural England) and Northamptonshire County Council's Road Safety Unit and supported by Braunston Parish Council.

#### Why do it?

Speed checks show that often the majority of people caught are local to the village or surrounding areas. Some do not realise that they are speeding. Speedwatch is about changing peoples views on speeding in much the same way that drink driving is no longer socially acceptable.

#### How to do it?

Members of the community are asked to Commit to stick to the speed limit Sign an anti-speeding pledge

Display a Speedwatch sticker in their vehicle

Encourage others to do the same.



#### VICAR'S LETTER

Dear Parishioners,

Most of you by now will have heard the news about my being appointed as Vicar of Saint Anne's Woodplumpton in the Diocese of Blackburn. This follows the appointment of Rebecca to a lecturing post in Lancaster. We are both sorry to be leaving Braunston as we have much enjoyed living in this wonderful part of the country and have made many friendships which, of course, we are determined to maintain.

I shall be taking with me many happy memories of my time here. Chief amongst them are *BBC Songs of Praise* and the celebrations for the 150th anniversary of the church. I am also particularly pleased that we managed to raise £15,000 for our Millennium Project to build an orphanage in the Sudan. But above all I shall take with me the memory of leading worship in church on Sundays. It really has been an immense privilege to be your vicar and I hope that I have been able to help some of you along your Christian journey.

Woodplumpton is in a part of the country which neither of us are familiar with so it will be a learning experience for us both. The parish itself is semi-rural and takes in part of the Lancashire town of Preston. The church itself dates from the 17<sup>th</sup> century and has neither spire nor steeple and therefore no ring of bells. In other ways the parish is quite similar to Braunston; it even has a canal, the Lancaster canal, running through part of it.

Though 150 miles away, it would be lovely if people were able to come to my induction on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> October at 7.30 pm at Woodplumpton. My final service as Team Vicar of Braunston will be the Parish Eucharist on Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> September at 10.30 am.
