## Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

I was talking to someone the other day and was a bit taken aback when the person expressed surprise when I said I spent 50% of my time in Daventry. I guess it is one of those things I assume people know!

When I was 'installed' in Braunston four years ago I was licensed as 'Team Vicar of Daventry with special responsibility for Braunston.' The 'Team' includes seven Parishes. There are now four full time Anglican clergy covering this patch.

The beauty and the challenge is that there is both an urban and rural dimension to the Team. There are no end of 'things to be done' and wisdom has to be applied as to what are our priorities and what gifts God has given the body of Christ (the Church) to meet the needs of our communities.

Daventry is by far the largest Parish (24,000 population at the moment) and this figure is likely to increase dramatically over the next few years. As a Team of clergy we work collaboratively on baptism, wedding and confirmation preparation. One week out of four each member of the clergy is 'on residence' meaning they have responsibility for all baptism, weddings and funerals which come into Daventry for that week. There are ecumenical and deanery meetings we attend as a Team of clergy. The Monday staff meeting is an energetic meeting where we take seriously our Lord's words:

'Where two or three are gathered together in my name, there I am in the midst of you'... as we talk through issues and seek the way forward.

In my time here I have witnessed the wonderful growth of lay ministry. We now have four licensed Readers and one in training, (people who have been called by God to 'preach' and teach in Church), a Pastoral Evangelist in training. Eucharistic assistants have also been licensed to take Communion to all the Elderly Residential Homes in Daventry and also take Communion to the house bound. Prayer for our communities is also going on regularly in each of the Churches. There are toddlers groups, and Sunday Schools in most of the Churches. Also assemblies are taken by members of the clergy in most of the primary Schools and occasionally in the Secondary Schools. The Holiday Club - run by 'Churches together'- accommodated sixty children in July.

'The Church' is the people - and none of the events and services would happen were it not for the hard work and prayer of Churchwardens, PCCs, and committed Christians who want to see the good news of God's love reaching out to all.

With Revd Ann leaving us and Revd Peter joining us the Team is in a time of transition. We need to seek God's

guidance to know how He is leading us into the future.

Between Jesus' Ascension and Pentecost the followers of Christ had nine days of prayer and broke bread together. From September 13<sup>th</sup> - September 21<sup>st</sup> we are going to hold 'Novena' (Latin for 'nine') – committing ourselves to nine days of prayer in all of the Churches of the Team. On 20<sup>th</sup> September at 7.30pm All Saints' Braunston will be hosting an evening of prayer and Holy Communion. It would be wonderful if the people of Braunston would support us on that evening, as we seek God's will together. But please also come to the other Services. (See the Church notice board)

The beauty of any team is that when people work together they can share resources, expertise and more can be accomplished than by working solo. 'Church' is not just the Vicar, or the building. Everyone is called to fulfil their God-given potential and share the gifts that God has given them. Whether this is visiting, hospitality, interceding, encouraging, working with children, preaching, teaching- the Church is the people- and more can be accomplished when people are released to use their gifts.

The latter can happen- when people are supported. For me I think that is the nub of what makes Team ministry so exciting and strengthening. It is the support that we show for one another. When I was the

only clergy in the Team for a period over the holidays— it was lovely to receive calls from Revd Liz and Ann from Iona and know that Owen was also praying for me from Taize, as well as receiving the support of the Church family in Braunston and other Churches in the Team.

Let's not give up praying for one another...



Saturday 20<sup>th</sup> August 2005 (Approx 10 Miles)

A bright sunny morning with a light breeze and none of the recent humidity greeted us as we met at the village hall. Just about the ideal walking weather. Eleven intrepid walkers ready to attempt the walk from Fawsley, to Preston Capes, Farthingstone and Everdon. After a discussion about the correct pronunciation of Farthingstone we drove to Fawsley and parked by the church and set off along the Knightley Way footpath past the lakes and steadily going up hill towards Preston Capes.

garden behind the pub which the publican's wife lovingly tended. We sat and enjoyed a well earned pint and sandwich before setting off for the home journey.

Opposite the pub in the church was an art exhibition which we decided to take in foregoing the cream teas advertised. Before we left the village we viewed the cloisters, built as a war memorial in 1930 and which is to be the venue for a jazz concert later in the year.

We set off up the road to rejoin a footpath at Heath Farm and continued until we reached the woodland of Everdon Stubbs and walking through the woods we took advantage of the shade and on downhill to Everdon. The footpath then leads across recently harvested fields past the trig point at the high point of Everdon Hill with fantastic views over the rolling Northamptonshire countryside. 



## From the Archives

No. 266 - September 1993 - Village Notes by Frank Cox

"One of the highlights of our gardening year must surely have been the visit of the B.B.C.'s "Gardeners Question Time" team for their recording here in March.

As summer bedding plants begin to fade we must be thinking of what can go in their place to provide for attractive, long-lasting Spring displays. September and early October are the times when Garden Centres will have a wide range of Spring bedding plants and bulbs. Bellis (Double Daisies), Forgetme-nots, pansies and violas can be all set out in September as many of us will also be putting out Sweet Williams and Wallflowers.

Towards the end of the month hanging baskets will need to be stripped down and replanted with winter flowering pansies to provide colour in the dark

winter days.

Lawns can be looking quite jaded after wear and tear during the Summer months. Spike the lawn to aerate it and brush in a top-dressing of sand and sieved garden soil. Oversow thin areas with grass seed and re-seed or returf bare patches. For the last few mowings of the lawn raise the mower blades."
