# **New Year - New Homes** for Braunston People.


The recent 'housing needs' survey, carried out by the Parish Council, proved that there is a real need in the village for more houses and bungalows to rent. As a result, Government money has been made available, to purchase land and provide ten properties - 6 bungalows, 3 two bedroom houses and 1 three bedroom house. Bromford Housing Association was given planning permission for the


development by Daventry District Council at the Planning Committee meeting on January 17 despite two letters of objection from villagers. The properties will be built on an area of 'exception' land (land which would not normally be given planning permission) This lies between number 64 Welton Road and 'The Rylands' and our thanks go to Andy and Tracey Cullinane and to Hilda and John Bradshaw for all their help and support during the consultation period.


The properties will only be available to

- People closely associated with the village. i.e. very close relatives or those working here.


Other people on the District Council Housing Waiting List will not be eligible and the properties will not be subject to the right to buy.

The aim would be to get it adopted by the local authority to ensure that the design of future development and any change in Braunston is based on an understanding of the village's past and present, contributing to the protection and improvement of Braunston's special character and maintaining the high quality of its environment.

An open meeting for anyone interested in this project will take place on Friday 30 March 2001 at The Village Centre at 6-30pm.



# HALL IMPROVEMENT SCHEME UP-DATE.

Our fund for this project now stands at nearly £15,000, which is almost double from that of a year ago. Thank you to everyone who has supported our fund raising efforts over the past year.

Much work has been done by the committee over the last 12 months to finalise all details, obtain planning permission and make the lottery application. We also commissioned a structural engineer to make a preliminary report on the Hall, to ensure that it could structurally withstand the major works that are planned inside. This report shows that the Hall is basically in good condition but that the roof, regardless of the project, needs structural work to the tune of £10,000.

The Quantity Surveyor estimated the building and refurbishment costs of the project to be £285,000 net. Together with the necessary structural improvements, professional fees and VAT, our new all-inclusive total is £396,500.

Our application to the National Lottery Charity Board, now for £300,000, was presented in January and we hope to hear the result within 3 or 4 months. We shall keep you informed. Obviously, the project cannot proceed unless we receive this major funding.

In the meantime, we will be considering carefully how we can find funding for the short-fall, which we estimate to be between £20,000 and £40,000. However, this could be more if Daventry District Council's reported financial crisis is confirmed and they make cuts in their budgets for such projects.

### Ward Action Service Plan (WASP)

The Parish Council is anxious to correct the impression, which may have been given by recent mailings and articles from Daventry District Council about the WASP scheme.

The Parish Council has not received and will not receive an Environmental Grant of £5000 from the District Council. It will not receive anything. The brief history of this matter is that when it was thought that Harrow Lane Garden would be a larger project than was eventually the case the Parish Council applied for a grant of £1095. The District Council takes on the story

"Based on this information [The application form and letters and conversations following] the Planning Department therefore set aside some 'provisional' budget for you, which is where the £5000 comes from. You should note that we did not confirm this figure with you, as the amount is not necessarily the amount that you would be granted..."

To date the Parish has not received the dog-waste bin, which has been promised under the scheme. This is in spite of the fact that the Parish Council has identified an appropriate site and done all necessary work to obtain the permission of neighbours.

On a, hopefully happier, note the Parish has been offered an additional bus shelter and a prospective site on the A45 identified. It is hoped that the work to erect this will commence in the near future.

There have been offers of other funds from the WASP scheme. As implementation of these will be in the hands of the Parish Council it is hopeful that work will go ahead.

The offers are £250 for a new seat, £1000 for additional trees and shrubs and £3000 for additional play equipment. The Parish Council would welcome ideas for these projects and in particular would like to hear from anyone who would agree to a new seat or additional trees near to where they live.

#### LIBRARY REFURBISHMENT

We thought the Library was looking a little tired, and, bearing in mind that it is the one room relatively unaffected by the Hall Project, that it was time to give it a facelift. We have therefore had it re-decorated and, with the benefit of an anonymous donation (for which we are very grateful), bought new tables, and a computer desk and chairs. We are now considering quotations for new curtains.

The library is very well used in the evenings for committee meetings and the computer sessions. It is mostly free throughout the day and at weekends and is available for hire, including free use of the computer, at a cost of £3.30 per hour for villagers. To book, please call Clare on 891580.



Our services at All Saints' were well attended, in spite of us being without our own Vicar in the village for this most important season in the life of the Church. Unfortunately we still have no news to give on when a successor to James will be appointed; we continue to pray that a suitable candidate will come forward.

In checking what items of Parish property had been left behind in the Rectory. Charles and I were amazed to discover a pile of complete sets of the Braunston Parish Magazine dating back to the late 1890's. We assume that Bevan Griffiths moved them into the "new" Rectory in the 1950's and they have lain undisturbed by his successors since. Unfortunately they are in a somewhat fragile condition and so can not be made available for general inspection, they do however, provide an interesting insight into the life of Braunston one hundred years ago and a valuable source of reference. The Rector gave his usual Tea to the Sunday School Scholars on the 1st

of January. Before tea, prizes of books were given to all who had made more than 75 attendances. It was satisfactory to notice that a goodly number had reached the required standard. The highest attendance of the boys was made by William Day, viz., 93; and of the girls, Sarah Kitchin made the same excellent number of attendances. After a plentiful tea the children were dismissed to play for half an hour, while the guests to the number of about forty, partook of the cup which "cheers but does not inebriate." On the return of the children to the school a great treat awaited them. For the idea of providing a Christmas Tree had been warmly taken up by the ladies of the parish; and subscriptions to defray the necessary cost were kindly given by Lady Evelyn Riddell, Mrs. Lowndes, Mrs. Bucknill, Mrs. Adamthwaite, Mrs. Baylis, Mrs. Ellard, Mrs. Norman, Mrs. Cross, Miss West, Mr. and Mrs. Simpson and Miss Hall. Miss Hall admirably discharged the office of Secretary, and together with the ladies resident in the village, decorated the Tree with lights and presents. The result was in every way satisfactory, and the children were much delighted with the tree and their presents, and signified their gratitude by giving hearty cheers for those who provided the Entertainment.

The Ringers, the Choir-boys, and the Choir-men, have all in turn been entertained to supper at the Rectory. It gives the Rector much pleasure to see them on such occasions, as he is fully aware and gladly recognizes that they are fellow-workers with him in the service of God's House, and can do a great deal by diligent attention to the duties which they have voluntarily undertaken to make the service of the Church beautiful and seemly. We have to record with respectful regret the death of our most gracious Sovereign Lady, Queen Victoria. The solemn fact wants no words. It has sunk deeply into all hearts. Her sorrowing people feel that as God has fulfilled one portion of the Church's prayer for the Queen, to "grant her, in health and wealth, long to live;" so they have good grounds for hoping that "finally after this life she has attained everlasting joy and felicity."
