

Dear Parishioners.

It is lovely to have this opportunity of communication through the 'Braunston Village News'. For those who may not be aware I am your new Vicar and arrived for a marvellous licensing service at All Saints Church on June 8th. I would like to extend a very warm thankyou to all those who helped to make it such a wonderful occasion. The Church was packed (I think there were three spare seats!) and it was very humbling to receive the support of friends from Kingsthorpe and to be welcomed so warmly by members of the Parish here in Braunston and Daventry. If you came you will know what a wonderful welcome the children from Braunston School gave with their song 'Celebrate', and I'm sure you will have enjoyed the buffet afterwards.

Since then I have been endeavouring to 'learn the ropes', and get to know you. Learning names will take a little while I'm afraid - so forgive me if I keep asking...eventually it will sink in! So many people who were newcomers to the village have told me that they chose to stay in Braunston because they found it to be friendly. In the short time I have been here I have found that to be so, and I look forward to getting to know you better in the years ahead.

My background is in education. I was a teacher in Derbyshire and Uganda for seven years, then I spent two years working with the homeless in Leeds, and two years with a Missionary Organisation which was sending professional volunteers to work out in Africa. One of the compelling things which drew me to All Saints was the visitors book, which is full of names of people travelling through, who are journeying on the canal. European names and people from all over the country. In a sense we are all on a journey, whether we have stayed in one place all our lives, or adopted a more nomadic lifestyle. I got to know God when I was young, and I can genuinely say that with God I have never found there to be a dull moment! Also I have found God to be my most faithful companion on life's pilgrimage. I am looking forward to what God has got in store for us here in Braunston. One thing I can promise you...it won't be (contrary to what a lot of people say about Church!) boring!

On that note...please can I warmly invite you to our Open air service at Braunston Marina on 22nd July at 10.30am. Please come – it would be lovely to see you.



New Drama Group Formed

Our village now has an amateur dramatic group - the newly formed Braunston Players.

It plans productions in the present village hall, and later to take advantage of the improved facilities of the new larger hall which it is hoped will result from a Lottery grant.

Following an appeal in the BVN for new groups to spring up in the village over 20 residents came forward with an interest in some sort of theatre group, either as players or back-stage. Many villagers remember with pleasure the series of successful pantomimes previously presented in the hall.

Indeed these were recalled at a meeting of enthusiasts who met recently to form the new group which is lucky to have the continued support and advice of two of the original producers as well as new villagers with other experience. It was also very encouraging to have five enthusiastic young people present.

Because of the time factor it has been decided not to try to produce a full-scale pantomime this year. But there will be a novel production with a strong festive theme near Christmas 2001.
