Stop Press - Beware

A number of village residents have received telephone calls from a **Home Security** salesman, claiming to be 'in charge of security' for Braunston and giving the impression that his company is part of some 'official' scheme and in one instance offering to install 'free' equipment.

Having checked with local authorities we have been assured that **no such scheme** is in place. The Trading Standards office has advised us that although the company may be genuine, in that it sells security equipment, the salesman may persuade you to buy a system unsuitable for your requirements, at an inflated price and with an expensive 'follow up' service.

If you are thinking of having a security system installed, you are advised to use a well known reputable company and to always get more than one quotation.

If there is ever an official scheme you will be notified in writing, in advance by the appropriate authority.


