The editors of the BVN would like to thank Jenni & Steve for their support and their willingness, each month, to provide a collecting point for contributions to the BVN.


## Braunston Village Gardens Association ANNUAL SHOW


Message from the new landlords Bruse & Diane

#### **DICK TURPIN**



#### Vicar's Letter

Dear All,

I have just been away on holiday and like all of us was totally knocked sideways by news of the terrorist attacks in the USA. From Greece we were able to keep in touch through BBC World news. But the repercussions of the events are immense; not only for the families of those killed but also the fear that American reprisal may cause the loss of more innocent citizens. Is there a theology which can cope with the unthinkable that happened on September 11<sup>th</sup>?

The psalms help at such times of human tragedy. Laments such as; 'my God, my God why hast thou forsaken me?' (Psalm 22) plumb the depths of despair. But the psalms have an uncanny way of twisting from despair to hope as God is acknowledged in the picture of human suffering; 'even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil...thou preparest a table before me in the presence of my enemies...' (Psalm 23)

We often relate to God as a teddy bearsomeone who is loving, someone to cling to in the dark. Yes, God is love, but He is also Sovereign and Judge. His Will will be done. There are plenty of Scriptural passages to support that in the end God will redress the balance of evil in the world. That is why those who suffer across the world-so readily cry out 'Maranatha', 'Come Lord Jesus'.

I think the world is grateful that the USA has up to now shown restraint, saying that punishment must be based on sound evidence. Yet there is also concern that violence will breed more violence. In the Church Times I read of a vicar from the UK whose daughter is missing, probably buried under the rubble. Movingly, he would prefer no reprisal at all if it meant that other innocent lives (like citizens in Afghanistan) were saved. You will all have your own reflections on this. But I do urge you to pray- to a God who in Jesus shows us His unconditional love for us. When he comes again His light will expose every darkness, and every tear will be wiped away.
