The stage adaptation, by James Roose-Evans, of this story about Laurie Lee's childhood in the West Country village of Slad in the early 1920's is colourful and touching.



### **Urgent Message to Householders**

After a recent serious accident in the village, when a resident lost an eye, due to catching her face on an overhanging shrub, the Parish Council is asking all householders to check their boundaries and cut back any shrubs or trees that overhang the pavement. Please help by ensuring that all foliage, twigs and branches are contained within the boundary of your property, so that such a tragedy cannot occur again.

### Face Lift for Churchyard

As custodians of the Churchyard, the Parish Council has recently had all the trees pruned and made safe. Many of you will have noticed that work has been done to remove the crumbling old tarmac in front of the Church. Repair work has been done to the drains and turf has now been laid. The effect has been to make the area look like a 'Country' Churchyard again. The work was delayed due to the unusually dry weather but we hope that the autumn rain will settle the turf and encourage it to root before the winter. Please help by not walking on it until the spring. Our thanks to Charles Dunn for obtaining all the necessary permissions from the Church authorities and for giving the turf a good 'drink' as soon as it was laid.

### New walks for the village


The exciting project to improve access to strategic footpaths in the village and produce a walks leaflet, historical booklet, interpretation boards and a CD Rom about Braunston and the Canal, is well on the way to completion. The project is led by the Dick Herne Braunston History Society, with the support of a steering group which includes the Parish Council, British Waterways, Northamptonshire Canal Partnership and Northamptonshire County Council. Funding has been obtained through grants from the Local Heritage Initiative Scheme and the Parish Council. The first gateways are now in place on the newly diverted footpath ED10, which leads from the canal towpath, over the bridge and straight up the field until it meets Church Road at the bend in the road, opposite the North West corner of the Churchyard. This enables people to walk safely round the village along the towpath, passing under the A45 at two points, instead of having to cross over the busy, dangerous road.


### Phase II update

We have had some good news on the funding front—Northampton County Council has agreed to contribute £5000 to the project, and £2000 has been received from Lloyds TSB. the result of our bid towards the end of November, so not too long to wait.



In addition, because existence in the rural community of Slad would have echoed life in our own village at that time, the Braunston History Society will mount a simultaneous exhibition in the Village Hall depicting Braunston in the 1920-30s. which should be of great interest to all residents.

### Vicar's Letter

Dear friends,

#### The Eucharist

Thank you to the person who put a note through my door asking: 'What is Eucharist?' This is a word we brandish around a lot in the Church and it can be confusing. The Eucharist is sometimes called the Last Supper, Communion, or Mass in different Churches. They all refer to the Service where bread and wine are received. The word 'Eucharist' and 'Mass' mean 'thanksgiving', the word Communion emphasizes we are united with God. So, 'What is Eucharist?'

This was one Parishioner's answer: "By taking the bread and wine I believe I am truly forgiven and I'm coming back to Jesus' path. Communion means a lot to me because I receive God's love. Jesus died on the cross, and through him I am united with God."

That marks the rhythm of the communion service. We confess our sins, preparing our selves to receive God's forgiveness. We listen to what Jesus has to say in the Bible. We remember Jesus' Last Supper with his friends - almost as though we are there. We see God's love for us on the cross, and we know what it is to be forgiven and at peace with God. God's living presence is with us when we reach out to him in faith (as you do with hands open at the communion rail.) He meets us where we are. I have heard many people say that when they leave Church they feel uplifted. Meeting with God you feel forgiven and loved - which is in itself spiritual bread.

On the fourth Sunday of each month we have introduced a shorter 'Simple Communion' Service at the 10.30am. We have tried to simplify the words of the service and make it accessible to all ages. It would be great to see you. Our next one is on November  $23^{\rm rd}$ .


# Two people needed to take on Super Derrick's round
