National Starch Site Development

After much negotiation the Bryant Homes scheme has finally been given planning permission. The three storey block of flats, planned for the top of the site, overlooking Welton Road, has now been reduced to two storeys, divided into two units and redesigned to be more in sympathy with the village setting and the adjacent listed buildings.

Many villagers have expressed an interest in the development, which consists of 55 new dwellings together with the conversion of Eastfield House (the main office block) to 4 dwellings. Included in the 55 new dwellings will be 9, one and two bed affordable social housing properties for rent. Those trees on the site which have preservation orders and are in sound condition will be protected and retained. Those not in sound condition will be replaced by semi mature trees, which will be given preservation orders.

The applicant has been requested to route construction traffic via the A361 to minimise lorry movements through the village.

Jetty Field and the spinney, together with the old allotments, will be transferred to the Parish Council, together with £10,000 for future maintenance, two months after work commences on the site.

New Bus Route

After years of pressure from the Parish Council and your District Councillor, the bus service to Ashby Road and Spinney Hill is being restored. There will be two new bus stops, one on each road.

The original service was withdrawn because congested car parking prevented the bus from negotiating Ashby Road and the junction between Spinney Hill and Welton Road was difficult to negotiate due to road levels. However two recent trial runs met with no such difficulties with parked cars and the new junction at Welton Road has smoothed out the levels so Amos Coaches have agreed to restore the service.

Residents are asked to be considerate when parking to allow the bus a clear run. The new service will be of great benefit to those living on the hill, particularly pensioners but it will be a case of use it or lose it. The new service starts on Monday 28th April.


