Are you eligible for Travel Concessions?

Men and women now qualify for a half fare permit or travel tokens at age 60 or over. You are also entitled if you are blind, partially sighted or disabled, or if you are identified as a travelling companion to someone in receipt of travel tokens who requires assistance in order to travel on public transport.


The Travel Permits last for 5 years and enables the holder to pay only half the normal adult fare for bus journeys between places in Daventry District and some towns outside the District boundary. These towns are Northampton, Market Harborough, Rugby, Wellingborough, Kettering and Towcester.

If you prefer Tokens you are entitled to £30 worth of travel tokens free of charge. These are for use as a subsidy towards local travelling expenses. If you have had tokens before, you should by now have received a new application form in the post, if not, then please contact your local representative: Janet McCarthy on 890336. If you are new to the scheme and wish to apply, application forms are available from Janet at 19, High Street, Braunston.

How and when will you receive your concessions?

If you are applying for a permit, please send your application direct to Daventry District Council and your permit will be posted to you.

If you are applying for tokens, complete your application form (don't forget to fill in your pension number) and bring your completed form to the Village Hall Library on Thursday 6th March between 9.00 am and 12 noon when the tokens are to be distributed. If you have already delivered your form to Janet don't worry your tokens will be waiting for you at the Village Hall with the rest.



Wellington Bomber Crashes in Braunston 28th August 1942

The question posed in last month's edition has raised much interest particularly from Chris Hedge, from Derrick Turner's out-ofvillage friend but especially



from John Berry who saw it happen! The plane was

based at Chipping Warden airfield (now used for car storage). This was an operational training station and the plane was probably on a training exercise before being posted to active service. The Wellington was the mainstay of Bomber Command 1939-42 but saw service through the war. It was designed by Barnes Wallis of Dambuster fame and 11,391 were built. It was nicknamed the "Wimpy" after a pre-1939 newspaper strip cartoon featuring a chubby, hamburger eating trencherman named J. Wellington Wimpy. It normally had a crew of five.

John Berry, whose father was the local butcher and commander of the village Home Guard, recalls how he joined his father in his van as they went across the fields to the crashed plane to find it on fire with live ammunition exploding. His father rescued the badly injured rear gunner and another crew member and took them both towards hospital in the butcher's van. Some of the crew jumped into the canal to get away from the flames.

The plane crashed into a field called 'Brockage field' between Barby Lane and the Coventry canal not far from what was popularly known as the 'bathing bridge'.

(Does anyone have stories about bathing in the canal? - Ed.)

Our letter writing campaign, asking for money for our Phase II refurbishment, has been very successful of late - over £5000 received since December, as shown here:


Open Gardens Day 2003
