Best Wishes for Christmas and a Happy New Year

Another year ends. We hope you have enjoyed the BVN in 2002. We would welcome feedback on what changes you would wish to see in the future and would like con-

tributions from a wider range of village activities so that we can present a full picture of what is happening in Braunston and the achievements being made here. Once again the December and January editions are combined so that editors, printers and deliverers have an undisturbed Christmas break.

VILLAGE HALL-Phase 2

Although the final bill is not yet in for Phase I, the Village Hall committee is already turning its attention to Phase II. We expect to have over £8,000 left in our building fund after Phase I and have already started adding to it. We were fortunate to receive further grants from the Benham Charitable Settlement (£400) and the Sudborough Foundation (£100). Both these grant making trusts contributed to our last Appeal. We have also received £250 from the Mary Webb Trust: we have written 100 letters asking for help and hope to report more successes in future issues.

The Autumn Fair last month was a great success. Nearly every village group helped with this, with several donating all their proceeds to Phase II. This helped us raise over £500. Many thanks to everyone involved (especially Clare and Chris) for all the effort put in, and to all those who came and supported the event – there was a great turn-out, despite the awful weather.

How can YOU help?





Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends

Come to Church: Put 'Christ' back into Christmas

I met today a friend for coffee. She and her sister were both desperately wanting a family four years ago and now have a son each. One will be going to school next year and the other is at that boisterous two stage! I remember when Matthew and Ben were born, members of the Church were overjoyed because we had prayed for the families. Seeing my friend today reminded me of two things. Firstly the power of prayer, and secondly the incredible bond a Mum has for her son, as my friend related Matthew's latest antics!

Christmas is a very important family time. Time to spend together and strengthen those family bonds. The glitter and wrapping of Christmas is in itself fun, but if we leave it at that we miss the point of our celebration. The central part of Christmas is about relationship. Our relationship with those we love and God's relationship with us. Just as we prayed that Matthew and Ben might be born, there were people who expectantly hoped that God would come and be a 'light to the world'. They were the prophets.

I'm not sure they expected a baby of a teenage mother, born in a poor stable (hardly fit for a king!) but he grew through the boisterous two stage and grew up to be the greatest gift to humankind. Advent is where we are now- and as we open advent calendars and light the advent wreath we ask God to make us ready for Christ's coming. Living as those who walk in his light, in what can often feel like an uncertain world. As the preparations take place for Christmas it's also good to prepare our hearts for his coming.

We warmly invite you to all or any of the services. Take time out to bring yourselves and your tiredness from the bustle and activity of family preparations, to glimpse the wider perspective as we worship the new born King - he is the answer to our prayers.



From our archives.....

...... Village Notes by Dick Herne - March 1991

The present road in to the village makes a right angle turn by Westfield Farm House. This was built about 1815 on a new site purchased from the lord of the manor. It passed through several hands before it was bought in 1853 by Mrs Eliza Butlin, widow of a cavalary officer stationed at Weedon. She already owned the cottage lower down the hill now known by her name. She settled both houses on her son's wife and children who occupied Westfield until it was sold to pay debts and came into the possession of Mr Joseph Green in 1911. There is a gravestone in the churchyard commemorating Admiral John Jones of Westfield House who died in 1878.

At the entrance to the village the church faces the Old Rectory, or Merry Hill House as it is now called. Both buildings are monuments to the vision and energy of Rev. A.B.Clough, Rector of Braunston 1838 - 70. He was a fellow of Jesus College, Oxford, the patrons of the living. Soon after his arrival he married the daughter of Mr R.H. Lamb of Bragborough Hall, a house built in 1820 in the classical style. Clough paid for a new Rectory constructed on similar lines to receive his bride. It had a handsome facade and at the back an imposing colonade overlooking the spacious garden and the valley below. The entrance hall and main rooms were lofty and well lighted, and there were extensive sevants' quarters. The Rector employed a considerable staff, including resident cook, maids and nursemaids.
