# First phase completed


The first phase of improvements to the Village Hall has been completed and the Hall was ready for the annual Fruit Flower and Vegetable Show on 7<sup>th</sup> September. The Show attracted a good range of entries - full results are shown on page 2.

It was wonderful to see so many attending the Show, and everyone seemed suitably impressed with the new facilities. Apart from the new main access suitable for disabled users, the principal works were the complete refurbishment of the existing toilets, the installation of a new toilet for people with disabilities which also has baby-changing facilities. Some improvements have also been made to the storage needed by the Hall's regular user groups but more needs to be done. Our picture shows the new doorway and ramp — rather more tasteful that a picture of the new loos!

Readers will recall that two years ago it had been hoped to undertake a fundemental restructuring of the whole building which began as the village school in the mid 19th century. The objective was to provide more space and to bring all aspects up to the standard expected in the 21st century. This project was dependent upon a large lottery grant. Unfortunately our bid was unsuccessful and the only way forward was to draw up a programme of phased improvements and all the fundraising that goes with it. Our August edition recorded thanks to the many contributors.

With Phase 1 bought to a satisfactory conclusion attention is now turning to Phase 2. The scope of the work includes lowering the level of the Games Room floor to that of the main Hall, which will overcome the final obstacle for wheelchair users of the Hall. This work will impact on the kitchen, which is already overdue for refurbishment. A new sound-proof partition will be installed between the two halls, to allow two events to take place at the same time, without disturbance. It will also allow spill-over from the main hall for larger events. A new heating system is also necessary, as the 30 year old storage heaters are nearing the end of their useful life. Architects have already drawn up the outline design for Phase 2. We believe it may cost around £80,000. Tenders will be sought when money permits.

We are now actively seeking further funding partners and we also look forward to the continuing support of the village in our fund-raising activities.



THE 200 GLUB

The 200 Club was started about 30 years ago to raise money for the Village Hall. It is run by an independent organiser under the financial control of the Village Hall Committee with the draw usually made at the Bingo on Thursday each week. £1 paid (equivalent to 25p a week) covers four weeks of draws with the chance to win prizes of £50, £10 and £5. Prizes are announced in the window of the old post office and on the Village Hall noticeboard and delivered to the winners. Approximately half of the money raised is paid in prizes, the rest being used to help run and maintain the Village Hall.

It is thought that there are many people in the village who do not know about the 200 Club who would like to join and in so doing make a regular contribution to help with improving and maintaining the Hall as a valuable village amenity as well as having a chance to win a prize. To that end a scheme has been introduced that will enter new members into the weekly draw for an annual payment of £13 for one number, £26 for two numbers etc paid by Standing Order. If you are already a member you are welcome to transfer to paying by standing order. All new standing orders will be acknowledged indicating the date on which your number first entterd the draw.
