## Village Hall improvements underway

After many years of planning and fund-raising, improvement works to the Village Hall have at last started. A 6 week project to provide a new entrance door and ramp, a toilet for the disabled with a baby-changing table, and complete refurbishment to the ladies and gents, commenced this week. The hall will be closed during this time, but will re-open on Monday, 2<sup>nd</sup> September.

Many thanks to all those people and bodies who have helped in our fund raising efforts which have allowed this £48,000 Phase 1 project to proceed. These include Northampton, Daventry and Braunston councils, Daventry Area Committee, Awards for All, The Ford of Britain Trust, David Wilson Homes, Morrisflex, and British Waterways. Many individuals and Village Groups have also donated money directly to our project - Peter Andrews, Jan Wilcox, K&J Andrews, Braunston Bowls Club, Braunston WI, The Angling Club, The Gardens Association, Braunston Players, Braunston School of Dance, - and we have received widespread support in our diverse fund-raising activities, as well as our regular 200 club fundraising. In addition, we have been fortunate to secure the services of Lambert Smith Hampton who are managing this project free of charge. Thank you to everyone involved.


To celebrate completion of the Phase 1 project, we are grateful to the Gardens Association for allowing us to share in their Village Show on Saturday September 7th, when we will be able to "show" our new facilities. There will be free entry, so anyone who wishes to see what has been going on will be welcome to come along in the afternoon.

Fund raising is still continuing, as we are now turning our attention to Phase 2, and the two halls which need substantial work to bring them into good condition, and accessible to all. We will therefore be raising money for this at British Waterway's Boat Gathering on Sunday, 25th August, where we will have a tombola, a book stall and a skittles competition.

## Parish Council News.....

#### Did you know?

Parishioners now have the opportunity to 'have their say' at the beginning of every Parish Council meeting. The Parish Council have set aside 15 minutes from 7.30pm to 7.45pm for anyone who would like to raise an issue, make a complaint or make a suggestion as to how the village could be improved. Matters raised can be dealt with immediately if appropriate, otherwise they may be made an agenda item for the next meeting when all relevant information can be made available and a proper decision can be taken. In normal circumstances, as time is limited, each speaker will be allowed 5 minutes.

So here is the chance you have been waiting for, an opportunity to influence decisions that affect your village. Come along and have your say.

#### Footpaths and Roads

Following the Parish Councils complaints about the condition of our roads and footpaths, a representative from Northamptonshire County Council has visited the village and has inspected all areas including Little Braunston. Because of financial constraints, there seems to be little hope of much in the way of major improvements in the near future and the appalling surface to the High Street seems set to try us for a time yet. However all is not doom and gloom, we have received word that the following works will take place. The sunken manhole cover in the centre of the road outside the Church is to be raised and levelled. All road markings in the village will be repainted.

Some new kerbs and road resurfacing on the corners of North and South Close. (We have been advised that these will be treated as 'urgent').

County engineers to reinspect Butlins Hill reference reoccurrence of spring water and associated potholes. A 'major scheme' bid will be made to fund levelling and resurfacing for the whole of the Church Road footpath.

Recommendation to Daventry District Council that a cherry tree in Archer Avenue should be replaced with a more suitable tree and the footpath repaired.

The Parish Council will be monitoring progress on all of these works.

A45 Good news at last for residents and road users. The A45 has been 'de trunked' and is no longer the responsibility of the Highways Agency. Northamptonshire County Council now have control over the road, its repairs, speed and signage. This will allow the long campaigned for speed restrictions to be applied. The Parish Council has been advised that 40 mile an hour signs will be installed between the Onley turn and the bend above Hill Row. The reduction in speed should bring welcome relief to residents in the area particularly those in Hill Row who daily take their lives into their hands every time they pull out onto the A45. We have not yet received notice of the date when work will commence, however we shall be pressing for the earliest date possible.

#### Youth Parish Council

We are exploring the possibility of setting up a Youth Parish Council, to encourage youngsters to take an interest in local issues and responsibility for some aspects of village life. It is clear from the spate of vandalism and bad behaviour, that some of our young people feel excluded and separate from the rest of the community. They seem to be oblivious to the upset their behaviour causes and give no thought to the financial cost to the village. The Parish Council would be interested to hear parishioners views and in particular we would like to hear from any interested young people between the ages of 11 and 17.

## Neighbourhood Watch

The Parish Council is working together with Northamptonshire Police to establish an effective Neighbourhood Watch within the village. 


#### Broadband Internet Access for Braunston?
