There was a very good response to last month's appeal for help to tidy up the village. Here are some of the volunteers about to start on Saturday 20th April




Village Hall News

HEALTH BULLETIN:

Does your child have a mobile phone?

There is much debate about the risks of radiation from mobile phones and the Dept of Health has issued a circular (Janet McCarthy 890336 can give further information). Although no hazard has been proved, there are gaps in scientfic knowledge. However, it is known that using mobile phones does affect brain activity. Since the brain is still developing in teenagers they must be more vulnerable than adults.

The UK Chief Medical Officers strongly advise that where children and young people do use mobile phones they should be encouraged to::-

- ♦ use the phone for essential purposes only
- ♦ keep calls short talking for long periods prolongs exposure and should be discouraged

Sunday 5th May Braunston Waterway Walk




A Guided Canal Walk led by Clive Goodchild (History Society Chairman) to explore Braunston's canal heritage.

Dear All,

One thing I was told at theological College and which has been borne out in ministry is; 'you cannot please all of the people all of the time'. We all have different preferences and different likes and dislikes- and none is this more so than when it comes to Church liturgy and music. Some like Common worship, and some like BCP. Some like music you can click your fingers to, and some like hymns with poetry, which transcends the common place. Some in their new found enthusiasm desire energetic worship, and others in more 'traditional' worship find an order that frees.

As a vicar I think what should come with the job is a tin hat and a thick skin! For someone's 'that was great' is another's, 'oh dear that was awful!' For someone's 'this is how it should be' is another's nostalgic 'this is how it used to be'. I suppose as a relatively new Vicar I'm taking the opportunity to 'sound off'! Perhaps you would like an opportunity to 'sound off' too? Some of us are very good at telling the Vicar when we're not happy, but others of us 'suffer or are uplifted' quietly. In the next two months I will be issuing a questionnaire – basically with an opportunity for you to comment on what you find helpful in our services and what you find less helpful. These will be gathered in and the information collated to see how the Church can serve the people of Braunston.

Some of you may have come to a conclusion about All Saints through what you have heard second hand. If you would like to attend a service next month and pick up one of these questionnaires then that would be brilliant.

Week by week I actually learn a lot from our local School and the children. In the playground there are yellow seats and if one of the children feels a bit out of sorts, or a bit lonely they go and sit on it.

There are children who have volunteered to be 'playground friends'- they go and sit by the person who is on their own, listen and talk to them.

In filling in our questionnaires the question isn't only about 'what do I want?' but what will minister to this person the elderly, the parent, the teenager, the child... Church has to be for all of us, so maybe there are some things which are close to our heart which we have to let go of - for the benefit of the child who is wriggly after 50 minutes, or at the other end of the spectrum - for the benefit of those who love to hear the hymns they grew up with. It's about sitting next to - and befriending the other's point of view.



The 'Mill House' pub site - second instalment

Last month's instalment described the site as forming part of the Alehouse Ground on an 18th century map of Braunston. This month it is intended to indicate some of the earlier history, bearing in mind that the documentary evidence is minimal, so that much conjecture is involved; and for that reason, this month's sequence is devoid of specific dates.

In the medieval period, it would have been farmed under the "open fields" system, whereby individuals were allocated single strips (each measuring approximately 8 yards by 2000 yards) scattered throughout the fields, which were unfenced (hence open). Ploughing of these strips resulted in the corrugated "ridge and furrow" landscape still to be seen in the surrounding countryside. This would have applied to the "Mill House" site and the ridge and furrow although obliterated there has survived in the field beyond the later canal, which would have been a continuation of the same block ("furlong") of strips stretching southwards down from the main road.

The valley stream originally followed a course north of its current one; in effect flowing westwards immediately beyond "The Old Castle" (where the Wolfhampcote track crosses the cattle grid) meandering across to join the Learn by the present day sewage works. That stream would have formed the southern boundary of the "furlong" containing our "Mill House" site.

We can imagine the medieval farmers toiling there as they cultivated their strips; driving the oxen-drawn ploughs, weeding, harvesting, one crop one year a different one next; every third year fallow (uncultivated), following a rotation system imposed by the Manorial Lord controlling the village (the lands divided into three large areas called "fields"). The 'fallow field' would have been used for common grazing (cattle, pigs, sheep), the resulting manure forming a useful natural fertiliser. (To be continued in a later edition.)
