## National Starch and Chemical Site

Once it became known that the National Starch and Chemical factory was to close, the Parish Council contacted the owners, ICI and requested that the industrial use of the site should cease. ICI were also asked to consider a change of use of the land and that planning permission for residential use of the site should be sought. The Parish Council also requested that in recognition of the long association with the village, the Pocket Park (Jetty Fields and Spinney) together with the Allotments, should be donated to the Council, to hold in trust for the village, in perpetuity.

Months of negotiations between the parties involved (including a prospective developer) have resulted in Daventry District Council granting Outline Planning Permission for residential development on the site. The permission is subject to many conditions, including the retention of the old walls and buildings fronting Welton Road and the retention of the walls on Dark Lane. The permission stipulates that 'the site shall be developed with a mix of dwelling types to the density of at east 35 dwellings per net hectare

The handing over of the Pocket Park and Allotments to the village is also a condition of the permission. There is also the requirement to provide 15% of affordable housing (to rent) for Braunston people or those closely associated with the village through family or work. Both of these conditions are subject to separate legal agreements. At the time of writing, the agreements are in the hands of solicitors and have not yet been signed but we hope that we shall be able to report 'completion' and give you a further 'up date' in the March issue of




## Village Hall gains £5000 lottery award

Good news! We have been awarded £5,000 from the AWARDS FOR ALL fund. This is a substantial part of the cost of converting a store room into a toilet suitable for disabled users, with provision for a baby changing table. We want to raise the rest of the money and, hopefully, further sums for the refurbishment of the existing ladies and gents. ( It makes sense to

do all the loos at the same time.) We would like to do the work in the summer holidays this year. The County Council's Daventry Area Committee has also given £500 to help with the provision of a toilet for disabled users - something we will soon be obliged to have. We need to continue active fund raising as we do not wish to eat into the major project development reserve - now nearly £19,000 - as we need to keep this for the next major stage of our improvement scheme which will involve lowering the Games Room floor, refurbishing the two halls and kitchen, providing more storage, new heating, etc. We hope to make this the subject of a larger lottery bid later this year. Stagewise development is necessary following the rejection, last year, of our £300,000 application for the complete revamp.

In the meantime, we are delighted to have benefited from recent fund raising efforts in the village. The Braunston Players' very successful first production (Dickens At Christmas) made a nett profit of £261 which has been given to us to improve facilities at the Hall. Many thanks to Fred Barnes and his cast for a very entertaining and well received production in December. The really good news is that the cast will do a 2nd production, so look out for news in future editions of the BVN.

Thanks to Cindy Brewster and her helpers for organising the Childrens' Christmas Party, which contributed over £100 to our funds and gave 26 Braunston kids a pre-Christmas treat. Cindy wishes to thank Morrisflex. The Admiral Nelson, Tesco, Sainsbury, Waitrose and the Co-op for their help.

### **Parish Council News**

#### Vandalism

Over the past three months the village has suffered from a spate of vandalism and petty crime, carried out by a group of youngsters of varying ages and from different parts of the village. The flower tubs have been repeatedly robbed of their plants or the plants have been pulled out and destroyed. The phone boxes have been damaged, the glass in the Village noticeboard has been smashed twice. Village Hall windows have been broken, fences pulled down and there has been victimisation of residents. Litter from waste bins has been strewn about and Christmas lights have been torn from the tree and cut into small pieces. The list goes

All the damage has been done during the hours of darkness, however some of the youngsters have been identified and quite a number of names have been given to the Parish Council. These have been passed to the Police, who have been asked to provide a more visible and active police presence.

Alarming reports have reached us that some of our village youngsters are taking drugs. An area of the village where this is reported to be happening has been identified and details given to the Police.

PC Bennett has asked villagers to report all incidents to the police, so that they can be recorded and appropriate action taken. All calls will be dealt with in confidence and caller does not have to be identified. 


#### New play equipment installed

Vicar's letter.....

Dear All,

This week we say farewell to a dear friend of All Saints, Cynthia Curtis, whose funeral takes place on Monday 28th January at 1.15pm. Cynthia joined All Saints Church when she and her husband Geoffrey moved to Braunston over thirty years ago. Cynthia came from a Baptist background, but she wanted to support the local Church. Occasionally Cynthia's preferences would show through. For example she could never come to terms with the Anglican tradition of having a bare Church through Lent and Advent, and she felt the Church was too modest in advertising it's services! This week in Church we celebrate a week praying for Christian unity and for me Cynthia exemplified this. She would look back proudly on her Baptist roots, but was primarily a Christian. She made her home with us, and we benefited greatly from her fellowship.

In an effort to introduce children to the concept of 'Christian unity', our curate in the Daventry team, Revd Geoff took Assembly at Abbey School in Daventry. He blindfolded a few children and asked them to take a crisp from various packets of Walkers crisps. The children (with their eyes closed) found it very difficult to distinguish between prawn, chicken, salt and vinegar flavour! They discovered one crisp, when you've got your eyes closed, tastes very much like another. You might like to try this at home!

The thing is a crisp is basically potatoes fried, with salt added, and 'the flavouring'. In a way Churches are a bit like that. We are basically the same- in that we all seek to follow God by following Jesus- but we have our own flavourings. The things that unite us are; baptism, communion and ministry. We baptize to show obedience to Christ, to show that we really want to follow him. We receive the bread and winesome Churches see this as a symbol of the body and blood of Jesus, some see it as changed into the body and blood of Jesus, either way we go from the Church strengthened by him. In ministry all Churches want to extend God's Kingdom of love and jusSadly, it is easy to dwell on our differences. It is good to be honest about them and acknowledge them. This can often be painful. I remember working with Roman Catholic colleagues and during mass, having to pass on the bread and wine without sharing in it. My friends' hurt was as great as mine. But differences like this cannot be swept aside, they have to be worked through and prayed through. People hold to their beliefs with integrity and this needs to be respected.

In the end though, there is more to unite us than to divide us. The first followers of Jesus were a motley crew. They kept their eyes on Jesus. Variety and diversity is a marvellous thing and this week we celebrate our differences, but celebrate also what unites us; love for our Lord. This sentiment is not only to be remembered in the week for Christian unity, but also lived out, as it was in Cynthia's life, day after day.

Why do we need to save energy?

Practically all our energy comes from burning fossil fuels at power stations or at home and this produces carbon dioxide which builds up in the atmosphere changing the climate. If we go on producing carbon dioxide at present rates environmental disaster is predicted from rising sea levels, floods and storms. The government have told us we need to reduce energy consumption in our homes so that the resulting carbon dioxide emission is reduced by a third over the next 10 years. By becoming more energy efficient each house could reduce the carbon dioxide emitted into the atmosphere by over 2 tonnes per year.
