





Something else about the Millenium....

From Northamptonshire Trading Standards circular:

31st December 1999 isn't just the end of the millenium; it's also the end of pounds and ounces for most areas of the retail trade.

Traders such as greengrocers and butchers have been allowed to use the Imperial System of Weights and Measures for sales by weight loose from bulk since the start of metrication. From 1st January 2000 all retail sales must use the metric system. However, there are just a few exceptions; the two common ones are beer and cider by the pint in pubs and milk in returnable glass bottles.

If you have problems with shoddy goods or dubious doorstep salesmen call Northamptonshire Trading Standards on 01604 707909 to ask for advice.

In the forests and lakes 350 miles north of New York city a reminder of Braunston! Stopping at a rural hotel we found a leaflet describing how the property had been developed by a Colonel Duryea. Nothing to connect with Braunston until one read that "he was a hard driving man who became a millionaire as president of the National Starch Company in 1890. His tough determination and his brilliant son, Chester, were the elements for his success in the starch industry. Chester discovered new uses for Corn Starch, and the shrewd business sense of the Colonel parlayed his son's ideas into millions of dollars. Ironically, Colonel Duryea was shot to death by Chester in May 1914. He was shot seven times in the head while sleeping in his Brooklyn mansion. Chester told the police that angels had commanded him to do it."

National Starch acquired the glue works in Braunston that had been founded by Mr Alderson Smith after World War I (described in Village Notes in July 1993) The National Starch company was itself acquired by Unilever who sold it to ICI speciality chemicals recently.
