From our archives.....October 1978 20 Years agoVillage Notes by Dancan Gallie

Naturalists tend to rejoice when they discover a rare plant, insect or bird which is uncommon enough to note - an osprey, a gold finch or a snowy owl. Common birds however are worthy of observation. The house sparrow always haunts the habitations of man. The adult male - marked by his black bib, is a perky, noisy, quarrelsome rascal, chasing round after females, fighting his rivals and making his presence felt. Though perpetually fighting his fellows, he seems unable to do without their company, quarrelling being as much part of his life as eating.

At harvest time the town sparrows seem to come to cornfields - always keeping to the margins. The nest is a carelessly assembled ramshackle collection of hay, or anything that comes handy - thrown together with none of the artistry of the thrush or the hedge sparrow. In some respects the sparrow is a nuisance, but the countryside would be the poorer without this noisy, cheeky, quarrelsome scamp of the bird world.
