Dear All,




### **Situation Vacant**

### From our archives.....VILLAGE NOTES.....published February 1993 by Dick Herne

On the south side of High St. between Cross Lane and the Green the tall stuccoed house with the slate roof has a varied history. In the early 19th century before the 1834 Poor Law set up District Workhouses - so called because the inmates had to work for their keep and it housed the homeless poor. Then it became a coffee house. More recently it was a general shop and is now a private residence. Next door the Old Forge is unususual in two respects. It was built of brick and the west end was a smithy belonging to Sam Cowley, the village blacksmith. The blocked up coal shute is still visible in the wall. Beyond the adjoining bungalows is a row of stone cottages. The first one bearing the plaque marked "R.E.M. 1742" was once a village inn. Next to the row is footpath, Burden Lane, leading to the Archer Avenue estate. This had replaced a huddle of old cottages which housed many canal workers and brickyard labourers
