This is now the eighth Braunston Boat Show - ninth if you include the Oxford canal Bicentennial Rally in 1990. "No one is more surprised than me at it success" says Marina owner Tim Coghlan.

More than 18,500 people flocked to last year's show with an increasing number of enthusiasts coming from overseas. The exhibitors are enthusiastic too- with all space sold out by March.

Jointly hosted by British Waterways and Braunston Marina - and this year organised by British Waterways, the event has become the shop window of the narrowboat building industry. With both floating and land based exhibitors there will be over 140 exhibitors.

Once again all profits from the Boat Show will be given to canal and local causes. (Last year Braunston societies received substantial sums.)

Historic boats will include *President* with her butty *Kildaire*. The sight of the pair negotiating the tight bend in the Marina before a cast of a thousand *gongoozerlers* is awesome. Bring plenty of film!



Braunston succeeds but more help needed

The message at the annual parish meeting on 22nd April was upbeat. There was lots of good news but a worrying theme - unless more volunteers come forward many activities that contribute to the life of the village will not continue. Brownies and Guides are in the worst position. They will close down in the autumn without some new adult helpers. (If interested call Jean Dibben 890515). The

School governors reported that there had been a helpful and generally good Ofsted inspection. The Friends of Braunston School reported a good year but would like to see more parents as members. Funds generated would purchase new play equipment. The Pre school is now operating 5 days a week and has has a satisfactory inspection record.

The Daventry District Council will be organising a major survey in the summer to find out what villagers want in the development of their villages. It was said that the parish is now secure from any sand/gravel quarrying operations but we are likely to hear a new proposal to reinstate the Great Central Railway.

The Dog Warden gave an entertaining talk but she is faced with the task of enforcing new laws that levy a £25 fine on anyone not clearing up their dog mess in a public place. Dog walkers really should carry plastic bags with them and drop the wrapped mess in a dust bin.

Footpaths in the parish are in a generally good state as is the pocket park at Jetty Fields. The Playing Fields Association have done a magnificent job fund raising and Braunston has the prospect of very good facilities in the future. Again, people are needed to come forward to organise activities. The Church continues to raise enough money to cover its own costs and still gives £1800 to charity but pressures are building up and more regular giving would be welcome. Floodlighting of the spire was applauded. Membership of the WI had increased but more younger women would be welcome. The WI was prepared to adapt its programme to meet thier needs. The short mat bowls club was flourishing although not winning many matches!

The cups that Braunston had won in the Village of the Year competition were on display. As a 1997 winner we will be handicapped this year so we must try even harder.

Scouts and Cubs are doing well but more adult helpers are needed. Their meetings will soon return to their old Den which they have owned for 40 years -Scouts would like to meet anyone having old pictures of the building in any of its former uses so that copies can be made.

The work of Thomas Birdsall in cleaning the streets was praised. The Green was being improved by putting electicity lines underground. New street lamps in a traditional design to reflect Braunston's status as a conservation area would be installed there.

Helpers to produce a "Design Statement." for the village under the guidance of a DDC planning officer would be sought for one weekend this summer.

A financial statement was presented - audited accounts will be issued late summer. Roddy Grant is resigning as Parish Clerk after 10 years in the post and was thanked for his loyal service.

Millenium celebrations in Braunston Analysis of the recent questionaire had shown strong support for revamping the Village Hall and for a stained glass window in the Church. As voting was so close it was decided to proceed with both. Tree planting was some distance behind in third place. The Village Hall project is complex in terms of defining precisely what should be done and raising the necessary finance. Proposals to the Millenium Fund need to be drawn up and volunteers for a group to do this will soon be sought. The meeting closed at 9pm with a vote of thanks to Janet McCarthy.

Village Notes by 'Hedgie'

Due to lack of space we have not been able to print 'Village Notes' in recent issues. Ron Hedge who sadly died last month was an occasional contributor and we are proud to be able to print one of his unpublished offerings.

Was Braunston parish once the scene of an incident altering British history? Probably not, but there could have been only a mile or two in it! The time was April 1660 and England was in crisis. In March General Monk with the backing of London had forced the Long Parliament to dissolve and new elections were being held. A free parliament would almost certainly opt for the return of the Stuarts. Monk, holding the immediate power seemed cautiously favourable but in early April General Lambert a leading republican escaped from custody, raised the standard of revolt at Edgehill with the nucleus of his old regiment and the likelihood of wider support. His plans called for a rendez-vous firstly at Daventry and then at Oxford. He soon occupied Daventry with about 1000 troops. Monk ordered Colonel Ingoldsby with his horse regiment to suppress the revolt as fast a possible. Ingoldsby came via Northampton where he picked up some reinforcements. Apparently undetected, Ingoldsby appeared before Daventry in the early morning of Easter Day only to find that Lambert, following his own plans, had just marched out. Following the tracks, Ingoldsby caught up within a mile or so and the two sides "in open field near Daventry faced each other across a stream". What followed was a scuffle rather than a skirmish. Some of Lambert's officers had been "got at" and refused to fight. After a single discharge of pistols damaging a few horses and much hectoring the rest were scattered and Lambert captured. A few weeks later Charles II was on the throne. Unfortunately we do not know in what direction Lambert was proceeding when attacked but there are indications that it would have been somewhere between Badby and Dunchurch.
