THE VICAR'S LETTER

Dear All.

We have now come to that time of year when most of us are finishing off the last scraps of Christmas cake and any remaining chocolates. Soon we will be thinking about hot cross buns and Easter eggs! Perhaps it is just as well that there is Lent in between!

Lent is the period of forty days which is used by the Church as a time to prepare for Easter through reflection and acts of devotion. Lent is often seen as the time to give something up, usually something like chocolates or alcohol but it is actually better to make the most of Lent by taking something on, for example by paying more attention to saying our prayers regularly or attending some of the Church's services. As well as this, we shall be running Lent house groups so that we can share together as we journey through this season.

However, before we begin Lent, we take a last look back at the events of Christmas. CANDLEMAS celebrates the time when Jesus was presented in the temple as an infant - rather as we baptise children toady. When Jesus and his parents were there a wise old man named Simeon came up to them and told them that Jesus would be a "light to lighten the Gentiles". In mediaeval times, when this event was celebrated, everyone would bring a candle into church. During the service these candles would be blessed and lit, so that the building was filled with light. This is how candlemas got its name.

Candlemas will be celebrated this year at Braunston with a Eucharist and Procession on Monday 2nd February at 7.30 pm. Please bring your candle with you.
