

Village Notes by Dick Herne.

The quality of life in the village was much improved by the development of main services in the 1930's. Electric light replaced oil lamps in houses along the High Street. The new council houses, opened in 1939, had electric light, piped water and sanitation. Many of the old cottages were occupied by evacuees during the war.

After the war sewage works were constructed and mains water replaced wells and street pumps in the village. New houses were built in Archer Avenue (named after an active local councillor), School Close, and on the Green. Private housing developed along the back lane - renamed Church Road. The increase of population made a larger school essential and this was opened in 1968 on a new site in Barby Lane.

UPDATE ON DEVELOPMENT PLANS: Following more successful fund-raising we are delighted to be making further significant investment in the facilities at the Playing Field - valued in excess of £8,000. This will include Phase 1 of the new Childrens' Play Area being three springers with safety surfacing, to be fitted week of 18th August, three new safety swing seats and three cradle seats, to be fitted during August, construction of the Petanque Terrain and a further six countryside benches and four picnic tables. Thanks to the many organisations and individuals for their donations which have enabled this investment to be made.

Our fund-raising continues to reach our target of £123400 and the good news is that just over £38000 remains to be raised to complete our plans. There are some funding applications awaiting decisions but we are confident that our target can be met. Your help and support - physical and financial - is still needed.

Our new notice board, courtesy of Mrs. Gurney, will provide more details of sport and recreation for the village - do make sure to check it regularly - our new and existing sports each have their own section, including Tennis, Netball, Basketball and Petanque together with the existing Cricket and Football teams.

The Parish Council are funding the complete replacement of the southern boundary fence which will be in place before Fun day; the adjoining landowner and the BFPA ask for the co-operation of all using the Playing Field not to take short cuts across the field and climb the fence as this will lead to straying livestock and damage to the new fence.

Recent damage has been suffered by the pavilion and the Playing Field, which diverts funds to necessary repairs instead of funding new facilities. If you witness any misuse or abuse please assist by informing PC Dickinson - please do not let the few spoil it for the majority.
