Village Notes by Dick Herne

After the Grand Junction Canal opened in 1805 Braunston became an important distribution centre. Goods were transferred from larger vessels into warehouses before going forward in narrow boats on the midland canals or by horse and cart. This commercial activity led to a great increase in the working population. Many small houses and a tower mill were built of local brick. A new brick village school - now part of the Village Centre - was financed by the National Society and local subscription.

The census of population held every ten years from 1801 onwards showed a steady increase while the canal was the dominant form of goods transport. The working population included those employed as boatmen or labourers on the canal, carters, cloth makers, tailors and bootmakers. Numerous building craftsmen were required for new cottages on the Green and in Cross Lane which then extended to the canal.

Braunston's prosperity was bound up with the canals which were moving the materials and goods needed by an expanding industrial society. It was adversely affected by the opening of the London and Birmingham Railway in 1838 and the subsequent growth of the railway network.
