Decorations are something that we all use in the run-up to Christmas but do we sometimes put them up without knowing what they stand for? Last year I told the story behind why we use tinsel to decorate the Christmas tree.

This year I want to tell you the symbolism behind the CHRISTMAS WREATH. Wreaths, as you know, are always made from evergreens. This is because evergreens symbolise the love of God which is always there and never fails. The leaves are tied in a circle which never ends. This vividly shows us that God's love has no beginning and no end.

If you want to make your own wreath this year all you need is some evergreen foliage, red ribbon, a hoop (easily made from a wire coat hanger), selotape and scissors. You will find that ivy loops round the hoop easily and is not prickly like holly. Fern can also be used.

I look forward to welcoming you to Church this Christmas and wish that the festive season may be for you a time of peace and great joy.

The London - Chester - Holyhead road passing through Braunston was surveyed by the famous engineer, Thomas Telford and several improvements were planned. In Braunston the main road was diverted from the Old Road to its present course down a gentler slope. It crossed the valley on an embankment above the old Berry Bridge and Castle Inn. It still passed by a cluster of inns; the Bird in Hand at the foot of Old Road, the White Horse where the old railway embankment stands, the Ship on the opposite side of the road and the Champion behind the last house downhill. There were still more pubs in the village itself!
