Village Notes by Dick Herne

The Isham family owned the Braunston manor estate from 1554 until it was bought by Sir John Webb in 1687. Gregory, brother of John who bought an estate at Lamport, made his money as a cloth merchant belonging to the Mercer Company in London. He invested in land, buying up the manor estate and the land held by Nuneaton & Delapre Abbeys in Braunston. His will describes the house where he stored wool for sale. The list of rooms corresponds to those in Tudor House.

His son Griseby inherited from his father and in 1585 he was in dispute with the copyholders, ie tenants whose title deeds were copied from the manor court rolls. The case went to the Court of Chancery which ruled that a copyholder was entitled, on payment of a year's rent, to sell his wife's copyhold and to lease his own for not more than twenty-one years. A widow was allowed to succeed her husband if she paid four pence! and attended meetings of the manor court to give evidence in local disputes.
