Village Notes by Dick Blerne

In the High Street, west of the Old Flough and a row of cottages, standing back from the road is 'Yeomanry House'. This is a two storey modern house but the name suggests that the site has older associations. The yeomen were the middle class of pre-industrial England and many were 'forty shilling freeholders' with a parliamentary vote. They were the backbone of the yeomanry, a citizen force ready to support the magistrates in upholding public order before the days of police forces. Their interventiom in a meeting for parliamentary reform in Manchester in 1319 to arrest Henry Hunt, the speaker, and disperse the crowd of 80,000 people led to the notorious Peterloo Massacres'. Casualties were caused when cavalry sent in support seized banners from the marchers. The yeomanry continued in existence after the establishment of county police forces until they were finally disbanded in 1908.
