750th Anniversary. Nov. 1st, All Saints' Day, 1970, marked the beginning of the celebration of the 750th Birthday of the Church. It was a pleasure to see a larger attendance than usual at the services. The Church was beautifully decorated and the Children's Exhibition was a joy to behold especially as the children were under the age of eleven. We congratulate the Headmaster, Teachers and the children on their work. On Monday morning, the whole school came to see their own work and also the parchments on which the history of Braunston was written. Few parishes can produce a record of baptisms, marriages, and deaths from 1538. We are deeply indebted to the Rev. Robert Binckes, Rector of this Farish, who copied the registers up to 1624. The Church treasures, chalices and patens dated 1570, 1657, 1720 and 1874 were on display.

Ancient manuscripts too were shown. It is interesting to read in the Churchwardens Accounts "payd to John Batman for catching two urchins (hedgehogs) - 4d! We read in the scriptures that two sparrows were sold for a farthing but in the year 1673, 2 dozen sparrows were bought for 4d. The East Window and the Font were designed by Mr. Butterfield, named by Mr. John Betjeman as one of the leading architects of the Victorian era.
