As Autumn closes in, we see swallows and martins gathering on telegraph and electrical wires - probably discussing their impending departure - how did they manage before the advent of the telegraph? The annual arrival and departure remains one of the mysteries of nature. We know why they travel long distances, but HOW they navigate vast distances and return to the very same spot next year remains a matter of gusswork - no one actually knows. Soon our winter visitors will arrive - V shaped skeins of wild geese will arrive from Northern Europe. Thanks to the efforts of Peter Scott and other Naturalists, the still come to the Severn Estuary and other favoured haunts. Gold finches feed on thistle seeds and we see acrobatic long tailed tit, fieldfares, and flocks of starlings from the colder countries of Europe. One robin has already made a de facto take-over of at least two gardens, and warned off any rival.
