The most readily identifiable of these is the Blackheaded Gull but his black (or more accurately chocolate) head is a feature only worn in the breeding season. Several can be seen this month. They have the ability of effortless flight - travelling great distances with barely a flick of the wing. They were recently circling several hundred feet above our Village, merely using the upsurge of warm air to lift themselves, wheeling round in a way which a glider pilot might envy. Birds like these inspired in Otto Lilienthal the ideas which made him a pioneer of flying machines, but we have not yet made a machine as efficient as the Seagull.
