VILLIGE NOTES: Our contryside is a happy hunting ground for those who visit it by car, boat, bicycle, or best of all, on foot, as observers of nature. However our County was not in the past just as we see it today. The division of land by ridge and furrow of our fields has been accomplished over several centuries. A thousand or more years ago, our village consisted of a few houses built upon this ridge - the springs providing adequate water supply. The rising ground provided well drained land above marsh and flood level.

Carves out from the forest would be those plots of land cultivated by men to provide their daily food, but the forest itself, which had stood for thousands of years still sheltered animals which today we see only in Zoos - Whipsnade, or Woburn Safari Park.
