HISTORICAL SURVEY OF BRAUNSTON - Class to be formed in September

Mr. Greenall, a lecturer in History at Leicester University, gave an interesting talk in the school on July 5th.

Mr. Greenall spoke of the need for a survey of the village in the period 1770 - 1970. The material for research is to be found in -

- i Six-inch O.S. Maps - both the latest editions and that of 1884.
- ii Enclosure awards 1760 - 80. (A copy of the Enclosure Act is in the Church Chest)
- iii Censuses, 1801 - 1971.

We may note with interest that we have a copy of the 1851 Census in the Church safe. Other sources are the Trade Directories of 1849, Minute Books of the Deacons of the Methodist Church, School Log Books, Parish Records, Vestry Meetings, Church Wardens' Accounts - also kept in the Church Chest. This chest is one of the sources of our Parish History and we are fortunate that the Rev. H. E. Ruddy, M.A., was such a keen historian and recorder.

THE CHURCH FETE on June 16th produced the splendid sum of £225.75. The raffles drawn by Miss Elsie Calloway at Southfields on July 7th produced £22. We are indebted to Miss Calloway for her hard work in selling so many tickets. The sum of almost £113 will be given to the Village Hall.
