WILLAGE NOTES. Gardeners, proud of their lawns, fight a continual battle against mosses, which compate for space with the grass lawn.

The mosses include some interesting specimens, well measuring the trouble of close examination. The stems are surrounded by minute but perfect leaves arranged spirally round a stem. These are surmounted by a spore case, usually shaped like a minute golf club. An elaborate mechanism will only release spores in dr. weather, and these are so light that they can float great distances, and settle on rocks or other places.

When red hot lava has obliterated all living things - as on Krakatoa, mosses are amongst the first living creatures to settle on the cooled lava and form a base fight a continual battle against dry

amongst the first living creatures to settle for other plants and make a desert habitable.
