to the danger to pe footpaths by dogs. for the behaviour o VILLAGE NOTES may feel obliged to prosecute. At the March meeting of the Parish Council attention was drawn to pedestrians and the health hazard caused by the fouling of dogs. The Council reminds dog owners that they are responsible iour of their animals. Should this nuisance continue the Council of their animals.

Among our bird visitors is the Grey Heron. Usually it haunts the Canal, streams, or marshy places, where it hunts for fish, frogs, rats, mice or beetles - all included in its diet. It is sometimes wrongly called the Crane. A Crane stretches its neck forward in flight but the heron draws its head back while the long legs, so useful in wading, trail hehind. Most birds entirely swallow their victims - flesh, bones and fur. The flesh is digested, but the undigested matter is formed into a pellet which the bird regurgitates at a time convenient to itself. By dissecting these pellets and viewing the bones of the victims an experienced Naturalist can find out what victims make up the diet of the bird.
