On the same pamphlet there are certain very disturbing figures for you, the laity, to ponder over. In 1975 there were 12,307 diocesan clergy and 2,050 non-diocesan clergy engaged in ministry in the Church of England. The number of priests expected to retire or leave the ordained ministry between 1975-80 is 3,530 and the number of men to be ordained is estimated to be 1500. There will thus be 2,030 less Clergy THE ORDAINED MINISTRY - TODAY AND TOMORROW. A letter from the Archbishop of Canterbury was sent to every Clergyman of the Church of England on January 25th 1977. He says in his letter "I am concerned, too, for our people whose spiritual growth and missionary outreach must not be allowed to suffer through lack of leaders ---. In 1976 the number of men ordained to the stipendiary ministry was the lowest in the past 25 years. If these low numbers continue the Church will face a man power shortage of considerable magnitude. I believe that the stipendiary ministry continues to provide the anchor upon which the Church's ministry is held secure. It must not be allowed to drift through the failure of the Church to provide sufficient men for the task"

In the Deanery of the Vale of the White Horse, of which the Rev. Denys Ruddy is at present the Rural Dean, it is envisaged that there will be only three Clergy left to work the whole deanery instead of the usual ten men.

VILLAGE NOTES. Recently an observant young lady in Braunston noticed something (roughly rectangular and measuring ½" x ¼" x ¼") having the appearance of a tiny honeycomb. Further examination showed that it was made up of cells from some of which the inmates had escaped.

Nearby was the shrivelled skin of a ceterpillar. The comb consisted of a mass of chrysalid cases of a Braconid fly. These had been developed from the larvae laid as eggs inside the body of the unlucky caterpillar, whose flesh and blood had fed the uninvited guests. Flies of this type are akin to the Ichneumons related to bees and wasps rather than true flies, being parasitic i.e. they prey on other insects. If we term the first parasite A we find that a similar but smaller fly B preys on the larvae of A. In turn an even smaller insect C preys on the larvae of B.
