THE DIOCESAN BUDGET. The Chairman of the Board of Finance for the Diocese of Peterborough says that the increase in the 1978 Budget compared with 1977 was approximately 15½%. He also pointed out that by the end of 1978 the Diocese could well have exhausted its reserves and that 1977 was therefore subsidising 1978. The Quota for our Parish for 1978 is £1,086. The Churchwardens, Members of the Parochial Church Council and the Stewardship Committee are asking for your support to fulfil our obligations. It means the support of those who attend Church Services, and also those who don't, to keep the parochial system going.

VILLAGE NOTES.—The smallest bird native to the British Isles is the Gold Crest Wren, the next the Firecrest. Both of these are fairly rare.

The next in this order is the Jenny Wren which is often seen in hedgerows and gardens in our neighbourhood. It can be found in every part of Britain where it may find a suitable habitat. The angle at which its tail is cocked up gives it a jaunty air as it hops through bushes and the undergrowth. It has two distinctly different calls - one like ch-rrr-rrr sounding angry - the other a very sweet singing note - much louder than we could normally expect from so tiny a songster. The nest seems absurdly small for its brood, but I suppose the wren knows its own business best.
