VILLAGE NOTES. Plants, provided with green colouring matter (chlorophyll), given water and certain mineral salts can build up foods necessary for their growth. Fungi, lacking chlorophyll obtain their foodstuffs from other plants. Those which absorb their food from other living plants are fungal diseases - parasites. These include rusts of wheat, beans, groundsel, potato blight and the disease introduced by the Beetle, with disastrous results, into our Elms. In autumn, dead plants provide food for fungi - hence the abundance of mushrooms, toadstools etc. Of these fungi mushrooms, ink caps, puffballs, morels, and the chanterelle are edible, but anyone unaware of classification would be well advised to take only mushrooms whose pink gills leave no doubt of their identity. The pinhead and green moulds flourish in the dead leaves and garden weeds in our compost heaps, and reduce them to a state in which their materials are once again put into circulation by being made capable of absorption by our garden plants.
